CHAPTER xxxi.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State under the Metropolitan Police Act 1886 and the Metropolitan Police Courts Act 1897. A.D. 1908.
[18th June 1908.]

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State has made the Provisional Order set out in the schedule hereunto annexed under the Metropolitan Police Act 1886 and the Metropolitan Police Courts Act 1897: 49 & 50 Vict.
c. 22.
60 & 61 Vict.
c. 26.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Order as set out in the schedule hereunto annexed is hereby confirmed. Order in

2. In settling any question of disputed purchase money or compensation payable under this Act by the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District the court or person settling the same shall not award any sum of money for or in respect of any improvement alteration or building made or for or in respect of any interest in the lands created after the tenth day of March one thousand nine hundred and eight if in the opinion of such court or person the improvement alteration or building or the creation of the interest in respect of which the claim is made was not No compen-

ORDER MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER
THE METROPOLITAN POLICE ACT 1886 AND THE METROPOLITAN
POLICE COURTS ACT 1897.

To the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District and all whom it
may concern.

WHEREAS power is given to me by the Metropolitan Police Act 1886
on the petition of the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District to make
an order authorising him to put in force with reference to land required
for police stations offices and buildings the powers of the Lands Clauses
Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by
agreement:

And whereas by section 4 of the Metropolitan Police Courts Act 1897
it is enacted that the provisions of the said Act shall apply with respect
to land and buildings required for the purposes of Metropolitan Police
Courts:

And whereas as required by section 4 subsection (3) of the said Metro-
politan Police Act the Receiver has presented to me a petition describing
certain land which he proposes to purchase viz. the land described in the
schedule hereunto annexed and stating the purposes for which such land
is required and stating also the names (as inserted in the said schedule) of
the owners and lessees or reputed owners and lessees and occupiers of the
said land and whether such owners lessees and occupiers have respectively
assented dissented or are neuter in respect of the taking of the said land
and praying for an order authorising him with reference to the said land
to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the
purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement:

And whereas I have considered such petition and the proof submitted to
me of the publication of the proper advertisements and of the service of the
proper notices required by section 4 subsection (2) of the said Metropolitan
Police Act:

I hereby in pursuance of the power conferred on me by the said Act do
authorise the said Receiver to put in force with reference to the said land
viz. the land described in the schedule hereto annexed the powers of the
Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise
than by agreement.
