



CHAPTER IV.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 relating to Glasgow University (Chair of Clinical Medicine and Chair of Clinical Surgery). [26th July 1910.] A.D. 1910.

WHEREAS His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland has after inquiry held before Commissioners made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 and it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament: 62 & 63 Vict. c. 47.

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Provisional Order contained in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be and the same is hereby confirmed. Confirmation of Order in schedule.

2. This Act may be cited as the Glasgow University (Chair of Clinical Medicine and Chair of Clinical Surgery) Order Confirmation Act 1910. Short title.

SCHEDULE.

GLASGOW UNIVERSITY (CHAIR OF CLINICAL
MEDICINE AND CHAIR OF CLINICAL SURGERY).

Provisional Order to vary and extend the deeds of Foundation of the existing Chairs of Clinical Medicine and of Clinical Surgery in the University of Glasgow to extend prescribe and regulate the duties of the said Chairs to provide for the election of the holders thereof and for other purposes.

WHEREAS by Deed of Foundation dated the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh days of May one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four the Senatus Academicus of the University of Glasgow (in this Order referred to as "the Senatus") on the narrative that John Matheson junior merchant in Glasgow (who died on the twelfth day of November 1878) had intimated that he was prepared in conjunction with others taking an interest in the matters to guarantee the endowment of a Chair or Professorship of Clinical Medicine in the said University with a capital sum sufficient to yield at least one hundred pounds per annum and had paid over the sum of two thousand five hundred pounds to found the said Chair and on the further narrative that the Senatus had agreed to accept the said sum for the said purpose subject to conditions contained in the said deed and herein-after mentioned and had by a minute dated the nineteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four resolved to found the said Chair did with the consent of the said John Matheson thereby found the said Chair or Professorship of Clinical Medicine in the said University and declared that the said endowment and the said Chair or Professorship should be governed by and be subject to the conditions and regulations following viz. (First) That the said Chair or Professorship should be called the Chair of Clinical Medicine in the University of Glasgow and the holder thereof for the time being should be a Professor in the Faculty of Medicine therein (Second) That the right of nomination or presentation to the said Chair should be vested then and in time coming in the University Court of the said University of Glasgow reserving always to the

Senatus the right of induction thereto as in the case of other A.D. 1910.
Chairs in the said University (Third) That the Professor
for the time being occupying the said Chair should teach
clinical medicine by lectures and other instruction therein
without prejudice to the claims of any of the other Professors
in the Faculty of Medicine to similar teaching (Fourth) That
the net annual income or proceeds of the foresaid sum of
two thousand five hundred pounds invested as in the said
deed mentioned should be paid as a salary to the Professor for
the time being occupying the said Chair (Fifth) That the fees
to be paid to the said Professor the duties of the Chair and
the arrangements connected therewith should be regulated from
time to time by the University authorities :

And whereas by another Deed of Foundation dated the
twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh days of May one thousand
eight hundred and seventy-four the Senatus on the narrative
that the family of the late Doctor Moses Steven Buchanan
surgeon in Glasgow (who died in the year 1860) had intimated
that in memory of their said father they were prepared to offer
to the said University the sum of two thousand five hundred
pounds for the Foundation and Endowment of a Chair or
Professorship of Clinical Surgery in the said University and
that the now deceased William Leechman Buchanan accountant
in Glasgow son of the said Doctor Moses Steven Buchanan as
representing the family of the said Doctor Moses Steven
Buchanan had paid over the said sum of two thousand five hundred
pounds to found the said Chair and on the further narrative that
the Senatus had agreed to accept the said sum for the said
purpose subject to the conditions contained in the said deed and
herein-after mentioned and had by a minute dated the nineteenth
day of May one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four resolved
to found the said Chair did with the consent of the said William
Leechman Buchanan thereby found the said Chair or Professorship
of Clinical Surgery in the said University and declared that the
said Endowment and the said Chair or Professorship should be
governed by and be subject to the conditions and regulations
following viz. (First) That the said Chair or Professorship should
be called the Chair of Clinical Surgery in the University of
Glasgow and the holder thereof for the time being should be a
Professor in the Faculty of Medicine therein (Second) That the

A.D. 1910: right of nomination or presentation to the said Chair should be vested then and in time coming in the University Court of the said University of Glasgow reserving always to the Senatus the right of induction thereto as in the case of other Chairs in the said University (Third) That the Professor for the time being occupying the said Chair should teach clinical surgery by lectures and other instruction therein without prejudice to the claims of any of the other Professors in the Faculty of Medicine to similar teaching (Fourth) That the net annual income or proceeds of the foresaid sum of two thousand five hundred pounds invested as in the said deed mentioned should be paid as a salary to the Professor for the time being occupying the said chair (Fifth) That the fees to be paid to the said Professor the duties of the Chair and the arrangements connected therewith should be regulated from time to time by the University authorities :

And whereas the aforesaid capital sums mentioned respectively in the said two Deeds of Foundation were duly received by the Senatus and were invested in terms of the provisions in that behalf of the said deeds and the net annual incomes have been paid and applied in accordance therewith :

And whereas since the institution of the said Chairs by the said respective Deeds of Foundation the successive occupants of the said Chairs have continued to teach clinical medicine and clinical surgery respectively in terms thereof :

And whereas under the Universities (Scotland) Act 1889 the whole funds of the said University including the funds above mentioned for the foundation of the said Chair of Clinical Medicine and the said Chair of Clinical Surgery have been transferred to and are now vested in and held by the University Court of the said University :

And whereas additional funds consisting of two annual sums of not less than four hundred pounds each have been offered to the said University Court by the Trustees of the late Henry Muirhead and St. Mungo's College respectively for the purpose of augmenting the emoluments of the said Chairs subject to the conditions that the occupant of the Chair of Clinical Medicine shall give instruction in medicine both clinical and systematic to students of the University without distinction of sex in connection with the Royal Infirmary of Glasgow and

that the occupant of the Chair of Clinical Surgery shall give instruction in surgery both clinical and systematic to students of the University without distinction of sex in connexion with the Royal Infirmary and it is expedient that the University Court should be authorised to agree with the Managers of the Royal Infirmary that the occupants of the said Chairs respectively shall be provided with all proper facilities and accommodation at the Royal Infirmary for conducting such teaching of medicine and surgery respectively both systematic and clinical in the lecture rooms or theatres and in the wards thereof: A.D. 1910.

And whereas having regard to the augmented emoluments of the said respective Chairs it is expedient that the said University Court should be authorised to prescribe the mode of election of the Professors to the said Chairs and to vary define and regulate their duties and emoluments and the disposal of the fees payable by students attending their classes and to designate the Chair of Clinical Medicine by a distinctive title and the Chair of Clinical Surgery by another distinctive title:

And whereas it would be of advantage to the said University as a place of medical study and research that the University Court should be authorised to make better provision for the instruction of students of the said University in the said Royal Infirmary and that Professors of the University should obtain proper facilities therein for the teaching of medicine and surgery:

And whereas for carrying out the aforesaid purposes it is expedient that the provisions of the said Deeds of Foundation should be varied and extended as in this Order provided:

And whereas the objects aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order of the Secretary for Scotland confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act the Secretary for Scotland orders as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Glasgow University (Chair of Clinical Medicine and Chair of Clinical Surgery) Order 1910 and shall commence and have effect on and from

A.D. 1910. the date of the passing of the Act confirming the same which date is herein-after referred to as "the commencement of this Order."

Interpre-
tation.

2. In this Order unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction the following expressions shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them namely:—

"The University" means the University of Glasgow;

"The Senatus" means the Senatus Academicus of the University;

"The University Court" means the University Court of the University;

"The Deed of Foundation No. 1" means the Deed executed by the Senatus dated the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh days of May one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four founding the Chair of Clinical Medicine in the University;

"The Deed of Foundation No. 2" means the Deed executed by the Senatus dated the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh days of May one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four founding the Chair of Clinical Surgery in the University;

"The Chair of Clinical Medicine" means the Chair in the University founded by the Senatus by the Deed of Foundation No. 1;

"The Chair of Clinical Surgery" means the Chair in the University founded by the Senatus by the Deed of Foundation No. 2;

"The Muirhead Trustees" means the Trustees of the late Henry Muirhead M.D. LL.D. of Longdales and Bushy Hill in the County of Lanark;

"St. Mungo's College" means St. Mungo's College Glasgow incorporated under the Companies Acts 1862 to 1886 on the twenty-ninth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine;

"The Royal Infirmary" means the Royal Infirmary of Glasgow.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Deed of Foundation No. 1 of the Chair of Clinical Medicine or in any ordinance following thereon the University Court may by an ordinance or ordinances approved by His Majesty in Council where an ordinance or ordinances may be necessary and where an ordinance or ordinances may be unnecessary by any competent procedure provide—

- (A) That the Chair of Clinical Medicine shall be called the "Muirhead Chair of Medicine" or described by such other distinctive title as may be agreed upon by the University Court and the Muirhead Trustees;
- (B) That the Professor for the time being occupying the said Chair shall give both clinical and systematic instruction in medicine to students of the University without distinction of sex in accordance with the regulations for Degrees in Medicine in the University;
- (C) That the net annual income or proceeds of the funds now representing the sum of two thousand five hundred pounds provided under the Deed of Foundation No. 1 invested as in the said Deed prescribed or so much thereof as may be required together with the aforesaid additional emoluments provided by the Muirhead Trustees shall be applied to the payment of a salary of five hundred pounds to the Professor for the time being occupying the said Chair and that any balance of the said net annual income or proceeds shall be applied as the University Court may from time to time direct;
- (D) That the election or presentation to the said Chair shall be vested in a Board of Curators consisting of eleven members nominated as follows (that is to say):—

Seven by the University Court;

Two by the Managers of the Royal Infirmary;

Two by the Muirhead Trustees;

And that the said Board shall appoint their own chairman who shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote;

- (E) That the University Court shall regulate the disposal of the fees paid for the instruction given by the holder of the said Chair (whether for systematic or for clinical instruction or both) the duties of the Chair and the arrangements connected therewith.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Deed of Foundation No. 2 of the Chair of Clinical Surgery or in any ordinance following thereon the University Court may by an ordinance or ordinances approved by His Majesty in Council where an ordinance or ordinances may be necessary and where an ordinance or ordinances may be unnecessary by any competent procedure provide—

- (A) That the Chair of Clinical Surgery shall be called the “St. Mungo Chair of Surgery” or described by such other distinctive title as may be agreed upon by the University Court and St. Mungo’s College;
- (B) That the Professor for the time being occupying the said Chair shall give both clinical and systematic instruction in surgery to students of the University without distinction of sex in accordance with the regulations for Degrees in Medicine in the University;
- (C) That the net annual income or proceeds of the funds now representing the sum of two thousand five hundred pounds provided under the Deed of Foundation No 2. invested as in the said Deed prescribed or so much thereof as may be required together with the afore-said additional emoluments provided by St. Mungo’s College shall be applied to the payment of a salary of five hundred pounds to the Professor for the time being occupying the said Chair and that any balance of the said net annual income or proceeds shall be applied as the University Court may from time to time direct;
- (D) That the election or presentation to the said Chair shall be vested in a Board of Curators consisting of eleven members nominated as follows (that is to say):—
- Seven by the University Court;
 - Two by the Managers of the Royal Infirmary;
 - Two by the Governors of St. Mungo’s College;

And that the said Board shall nominate their own chairman who shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote ; A.D. 1910.

- (E) That the University Court shall regulate the disposal of the fees paid for the instruction given by the holder of the said Chair (whether for systematic or for clinical instruction or both) the duties of the Chair and the arrangements connected therewith.

5. The University Court may enter into and carry out agreements with the Royal Infirmary the Muirhead Trustees and St. Mungo's College or some one or more of them in relation to all or some of the purposes of this Order and as to the provisions of any ordinance or ordinances to be made or applied for by the University Court for giving effect to the purposes of this Order and for more effectually carrying out the same. Agreement powers.

6. The costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the preparing for obtaining and confirming this Order or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid in equal parts out of the funds held by the University Court as aforesaid applicable to the said respective Chairs. Costs of Order.
