



## CHAPTER lvi.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 relating to the Muirhead Trust. A.D. 1910.  
—  
[26th July 1910.]

**W**HEREAS His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland has after inquiry held before Commissioners made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 and it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament: 62 & 63 Vict.  
c. 47.

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Provisional Order contained in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be and the same is hereby confirmed. Confirmation

2. This Act may be cited as the Muirhead Trust Order Confirmation Act 1910. Short title.

MUIRHEAD TRUST.

*Provisional Order to vary the purposes of the Trust and the application of the residue of the trust funds of the late Henry Muirhead to enlarge the constitution of and to confer powers on the Trustees of the late Henry Muirhead for the administration of the said funds and for other purposes.*

WHEREAS the late Henry Muirhead M.D. LL.D. of Longdales and Bushyhill in the county of Lanark by (first) a holograph testamentary writing dated the third day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight (second) a holograph testamentary writing dated in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine (third) a general trust disposition and settlement dated the thirtieth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety and sundry codicils of various dates all of which deeds were registered in the books of Council and Session the fourteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety directed his Trustees therein named after carrying out the other purposes thereof to apply the residue of his estate to the founding and maintaining of an institution for the instruction of women in physical and biological science (but not theological) and also to provide for women students receiving an education to fit them to become medical practitioners dentists electricians chemists or otherwise as more particularly set forth in the said testamentary writings the terms of which are so far as these relate to the disposal of the residue contained in the schedule to this Order:

And whereas the said Henry Muirhead died on the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety and his testamentary Trustees who accepted office namely Mary Muirhead Shearer Margaret Shearer or MacDougall Robert Franklin Muirhead Alice Margaret Muirhead Mary Muirhead Paterson William Caldwell Crawford Henry Dyer David Thomson Maclay (now deceased) Robert Goodwin Thomas Russell Alexander James Hardie Moffat Edward Gillespie (now deceased) Mrs. Christina Hogg or Gillespie (now deceased) and William Robertson Copland

(now deceased) entered upon the possession management and administration of his means and estate: A.D. 1910.

And whereas the Trustees having realised the trust estate and paid all debts due by the Truster and the legacies bequeathed by him and also paid the Government duties on the estate the free residue in the hands of the Trustees amounted to twenty-nine thousand four hundred and ninety-six pounds and with the accumulations accrued thereon now amounts to forty-six thousand and fifty-five pounds twelve shillings and tenpence:

And whereas the Trustees after careful and prolonged consideration of the testamentary directions of the Truster with respect to the application of the residue and the best and most expedient method of carrying the same into effect entered into communication with and sought the views of various colleges hospitals and institutions in Glasgow as to the most practicable way of carrying out the Truster's intentions:

And whereas as the result of the Trustees' consideration of the question a scheme of administration was propounded by the Trustees and submitted to and approved by the Court of Session on the twelfth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine for founding and maintaining in or near Glasgow a college for the instruction of women in physical and biological science as therein mentioned which should be called the "Muirhead College" in accordance with the directions of the Truster:

And whereas since the approval of the said scheme by the Court of Session circumstances have materially altered owing to the large endowments which have been placed at the disposal of the Scottish Universities for the benefit of students in all branches of a university curriculum and which render the founding and endowment of any separate medical college as contemplated by the Truster a precarious experiment and the application of the trust fund to such a purpose inexpedient and the said scheme has accordingly not been carried into effect:

And whereas the Trustees having been in communication with the University Court of the University of Glasgow the managers of the Royal Infirmary of Glasgow and the Governors of St. Mungo's College Glasgow with a view to the better carrying out of the intentions of the Truster with regard to the education of women by applying part of the funds towards the endowment or better endowment of certain medical chairs in the University of Glasgow and it is expedient that powers

A.D. 1910. should be conferred on the Trustees to apply the trust fund to the said purposes :

And whereas the said scheme not having been carried out or brought into operation it is expedient that the same should be abrogated and that the purposes contemplated by the Truster should be effected and carried out under the provisions of this Order :

And whereas it is expedient that the surviving testamentary Trustees of the Truster together with the other persons hereinafter mentioned should be constituted the Trustees of the trust fund and should be authorised to administer the same under the provisions and for the purposes of this Order :

And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees constituted by this Order should be further authorised to found scholarships and make grants for educational purposes and that the other powers hereinafter contained in connection with the regulation and administration of the said trust fund should be conferred on the Trustees :

And whereas the objects aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order of the Secretary for Scotland confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 :

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act the Secretary for Scotland orders as follows :—

Short title

of Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Muirhead Trust Order 1910 and shall commence and have effect on and from the date of the passing of the Act confirming the same which date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Order."

Interpreta-  
tion.

2. In this Order unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction the following expressions shall have the meanings herein respectively assigned to them (namely) :—

"The Muirhead Trustees" or "the Trustees" means the Trustees constituted by this Order ;

"The Truster" means the late Henry Muirhead M.D. LL.D. of Longdales and Bushyhill in the county of Lanark ;

"The testamentary Trustees" means the surviving and acting Trustees appointed by the Truster under his testamentary writings before mentioned ;

- “The representative Trustees” means the Trustees to be nominated by the public bodies under this Order; A.D. 1910.
- “The elective Trustees” means the Trustees to be elected under this Order by the testamentary Trustees or by the Trustees;
- “The clerk” means the clerk appointed by the Trustees;
- “The trust fund” means the funds of the Truster and all accumulations thereof accrued and to accrue thereon under the administration of the testamentary Trustees or of the Trustees as the case may be;
- “The scheme” means the scheme approved by the Court of Session on 12th May 1899;
- “The University” means the University of Glasgow;
- “St. Mungo’s College” means St. Mungo’s College Glasgow incorporated under the Companies Acts 1862 to 1886 on the 29th April 1889;
- “The Royal Infirmary” means the Royal Infirmary of Glasgow.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby constituted the Trustees of the trust fund and shall hold and administer the same under and for the purposes of this Order and for the other purposes specified in the said testamentary writings of the Truster so far as these are not inconsistent with the purposes of this Order (that is to say):—

- (B) The Lord Provost of the City of Glasgow for the time being ex-officio:
- (c) Six persons to be nominated as representative Trustees by the respective public bodies following (that is to say):—
- One by the town council of the City of Glasgow;
- One by the Court of the University;
- One by the West of Scotland Technical College;

One by the school board of the City of Glasgow;  
One by the Merchants House of Glasgow; and  
One by the Trades House of Glasgow:

- (D) Five elective Trustees (whereof three at least shall be women) to be elected by the testamentary Trustees and the survivors of them so long as the number of the surviving testamentary Trustees is not less than three and thereafter to be elected by the Trustees:

Provided that—

- (E) A representative Trustee may be a member of the body making the nomination or otherwise:  
(F) Women shall be eligible as Trustees:  
(G) Clergymen shall not be eligible as Trustees.

4. The clerk shall give written notice to the public bodies who are under the provisions of this Order required to nominate representative Trustees and request that such bodies should make such nominations accordingly. The said nominations of representative Trustees and the election of elective Trustees shall be made previous to the twenty-fifth day of September in the year in which such nomination is required to be made and the first nomination and election of representative and elective Trustees respectively shall be made previous to the twenty-fifth day of September one thousand nine hundred and ten and the persons so nominated as representative Trustees shall be duly intimated to the clerk by the public bodies aforesaid. In the case of the first nomination of representative Trustees the said written notice shall be given by and the persons so nominated shall be duly intimated to the clerk to the testamentary Trustees.

Term of  
office.

5. The representative and the elective Trustees shall hold office for three years from the date of their nomination and on the expiration of the said period the public bodies before mentioned and the testamentary Trustees or the Trustees as the case may be shall nominate and elect representative and elective Trustees respectively in their place and the Trustees going out of office shall be eligible for re-nomination or re-election.

Permanent  
Trustees.

6. From and after the death of the survivor of the testamentary Trustees the Muirhead Trustees shall consist of the

ex-officio Trustee the representative Trustees and the elective Trustees. A.D. 1910.

7. The office of a representative or an elective Trustee shall be vacated by the expiration of the term of office for which he was appointed or by his death resignation bankruptcy or incapacity to act or absence without the express consent of the Trustees from the meetings of the Trustees for more than twelve months consecutively and in the event of any such vacancy arising otherwise than by the expiration of the term of office the same may be filled up by a nomination or an election as the case may be by the body making the appointment and the Trustee so appointed shall hold office only for the remainder of the period of the Trustee whom he replaces. Office of Trustee held vacated.

8. At least one month but not more than two months previous to the expiration of the term of office of a representative Trustee the clerk shall intimate the same to the public body whose nominee the said trustee is and such public body shall proceed to nominate a trustee in succession to him and shall intimate the name and designation of the person nominated to the clerk previous to the next annual general meeting of the Muirhead Trustees. Nomination of subsequent representative Trustees.

9. In the event of any public body entitled to nominate a Trustee failing to make or to intimate such nomination at or prior to the annual general meeting next following the requisition to make such nomination or in the event of any representative Trustee declining to accept office the vacancy thereby occasioned shall be filled up by the Trustees by election at their next ordinary general meeting and the Trustee so elected shall hold office for the term of the Trustee who should have been so nominated or has so declined to accept office. Trustees to fill up certain vacancies.

10. The Trustees shall be gratuitous Trustees and shall be entitled to all the powers and privileges of such Trustees both under common law and statute according to the law of Scotland for the time being. Trustees to be gratuitous Trustees.

11. The Trustees shall be held to be properly constituted and may exercise their powers and functions notwithstanding that there is any vacancy in their prescribed number of members. Trustees may act although board incomplete.

12. At their first general meeting and at every annual general meeting thereafter the Trustees shall elect a chairman clerk and Election of chairman

treasurer of the Muirhead Trustees The office of clerk and treasurer may in the discretion of the Trustees be held by the same person at the same time A Trustee shall not be eligible to be appointed to the office of clerk or treasurer The treasurer shall also be factor to the Trustees and shall be required to find caution for the faithful administration of his office.

Interim  
chairman.

13. In the event of the chairman during the currency of his term of office ceasing to be a Trustee his place shall be filled by election at the next general meeting of the Trustees and his successor shall hold office only until the next annual general meeting after his election In the event of the absence of the chairman or of a vacancy in the office of chairman the Trustees present shall elect one of their number to act as chairman of any meeting.

14. The Trustees shall regulate and define the duties of the clerk and treasurer and of any other officials of the Trustees and shall fix their remuneration at such reasonable salaries or scales of remuneration as they may determine All officials in the employment of the Trustees shall hold their offices at the pleasure of the Trustees.

Meetings.

15. The first general meeting of the Trustees shall be held within three months from the commencement of this Order at such time and place as shall be fixed by the testamentary Trustees or a majority of such Trustees and thereafter the annual general meeting of the Trustees shall be held in the month of October in each year at such time and place as shall be fixed by the Trustees In addition to the annual general meeting the Trustees may hold such ordinary general meetings at such time and place as they may appoint.

16. The chairman or any three of the Trustees may at any time on three days notice in writing require the clerk to summon an extraordinary general meeting of the Trustees to be held at the place appointed for the holding of ordinary general meetings and if he fail to convene the same within three days of receipt of the said requisition the requisitionists may themselves proceed to convene the meeting in his place The requisition shall specify the object of the meeting proposed to be called.

Notice of  
meetings.

17. Notice of all meetings of Trustees shall be given by the clerk by post to each Trustee at his ordinary address or at any



address notified to the clerk by him as follows (viz.) In the A.D. 1910.  
case of the annual general meeting not more than twenty-one  
or less than fourteen days before such meeting and in the case  
of each ordinary and extraordinary general meeting not more than  
fourteen or less than seven days before such meeting and every  
such notice shall specify the business to be brought before such  
meeting and the date and place at which it is to be held The  
proceedings at any meeting shall not be invalidated by reason  
of the fact that each Trustee has not received due notice of the  
meeting.

18. At all general meetings of the Trustees five Trustees Quorum at  
shall form a quorum and if at the time appointed for a general general  
meeting or within thirty minutes thereafter a sufficient number meetings.  
of Trustees to form a quorum be not present or if the business at  
any general meeting be not completed the Trustees present may  
and if the meeting be an ordinary general meeting shall adjourn  
the meeting to such time and place as they may fix of which  
notice shall forthwith be given by post by the clerk to all the  
Trustees specifying the business to be brought before such  
adjourned general meeting.

19. Each Trustee present at a general meeting and every Voting at

entitled to one vote but in the event of an equality of votes  
the chairman for the time being shall be entitled to a casting as  
well as a deliberative vote All votes shall be given in person.

20. The Trustees may from time to time appoint a committee Committees  
or committees of their number for consideration of any special and their  
question affecting the trust or for any other special purpose quorums.

shall consist of less than three Trustees A majority of the  
committee shall be a quorum.

21. The mode of conducting business at general and com- Minutes and

22. The testamentary Trustees shall continue as such Trustees Administra-

Trustees. 23. For the purpose of enabling the Trustees to complete  
a title to any property or investments vested in them by this  
Order by expediting and recording a notarial instrument or notarial  
instruments or otherwise this Order shall be deemed to be and  
may be used as a general disposition or assignation as the case  
may be of such properties funds and estate in favour of the  
Trustees.

Titles. 24. For the purpose of taking the title to property and  
securities in or on which the trust fund may be invested the  
Trustees may appoint from among their own number such  
Trustees (not exceeding four in number) as they think proper  
for the purpose of holding such property and investments but  
the Trustees so appointed to hold property or investments shall  
not demit office as Trustees by reason merely of the expiry of  
their respective terms of office as Trustees Provided that in the  
event of their being reduced below three in number new Trustees  
shall be appointed and the title to the property and securities so  
vested in trust made up in the names of such new Trustees.

Discharge to Trustees  
and first  
Trustees. 25. The Trustees shall have power to grant a full and  
effectual discharge to the testamentary Trustees from all claims  
competent against them in respect of their intromissions with  
the funds and estate as testamentary Trustees previous to the  
first general meeting of the Trustees and on the accounts of the  
testamentary Trustees as such being audited by such person or  
persons as the sheriff of the county of Lanark may appoint and  
on the trust fund having been conveyed and made over to the  
Trustees they shall be bound if required to grant such discharge  
without prejudice to the testamentary Trustees applying for  
discharge in terms of the ninth section of the Trusts (Scotland)  
Act 1867 which mutatis mutandis shall be deemed to be applicable  
as though they were retiring Trustees.

Powers of investment. 26. The Trustees may continue the existing investments of  
their trust funds or may from time to time realise and invest  
the same and any additions thereto in any security in which  
gratuitous Trustees are or may hereafter be by any Public General  
Act applicable to Scotland empowered to invest trust funds.

27. Any money arising from the sale of timber or from mines or minerals on any estates of the Trustees or from casualties of superiority or otherwise being of the nature of casual profits of the trust fund shall be invested by the Trustees and form part of the same. A.D. 1910.  
Casual profits to be invested.

28. The Trustees shall have power to lease or feu any lands and estates belonging to them at a fair rent or feu duty to excamb the same or to sell the same either by public roup or private bargain provided that the lease feu excambion or sale be authorised by a resolution of the Trustees The Trustees shall have power to sell and realise all stocks mortgages and other securities forming part of the trust funds and they shall re-invest the proceeds except in so far as the same may be required for the extinction of debt. Powers to sell &c.

29. The Trustees shall cause full accounts to be kept of their capital income and expenditure Such accounts shall be made up as at the thirtieth day of June in each year and after being audited by a person or persons to be from time to time named by the sheriff of the county of Lanark shall be laid before the next annual general meeting of the Trustees An abstract thereof after they have been examined and passed by the Trustees in such form as the auditor shall from time to time prescribe shall immediately thereafter be published in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the city of Glasgow. Accounts.

30. The Trustees may make such rules regulations byelaws and standing orders as they think fit in connection with the administration of the trust so far as the same are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Order. Rules regulations byelaws and standing orders.

31. The Trustees may receive any additional donations or endowments for the general purposes of this Order and may apply the same in such manner as they deem most expedient for carrying out such general purposes They may also receive donations or endowments for any special objects or having any special conditions attached thereto provided such objects or conditions are not inconsistent with or calculated to impede the carrying out of the provisions of this Order. Additional donations or endowments.

32. The Trustees shall have a common seal which shall be under the charge of the clerk and such one of the Trustees as they may from time to time appoint All deeds and other writings Common seal and execution of deeds.

A.D. 1910. of a formal character sealed with the seal of the Trustees and signed by two of the Trustees and their clerk shall be held to be validly executed on behalf of the Trustees. No deed or other writing shall be executed on behalf of the Trustees except by authority of the Trustees given at a general meeting duly minuted.

Custody of

33. The Trustees may from time to time make such regulations and arrangements as may appear to them fit for the custody of all deeds and other documents belonging to the Trustees for depositing in and drawing moneys from bank and generally for the conduct of all business relating to the trust.

Scheme  
abrogated.

34. The scheme shall from and after the commencement of this Order have no further force or effect.

Application  
of trust fund.

35. So much of the trust fund as may be necessary shall notwithstanding anything contained in the testamentary writings of the said Henry Muirhead or in the scheme be applied by the Trustees for the following purposes or some one or more of them subject to the provisions hereinafter in this Order mentioned (that is to say):—

- (1) To pay primo loco out of the income of the trust fund to the University Court two several sums of four hundred pounds per annum to be applied towards the annual remuneration of the two professors of two university chairs respectively founded or to be founded by the University Court to be called respectively "the Muirhead Chair of Medicine" and "the Muirhead Chair of Obstetrics and Gynæcology" or by such other title or designation as the Trustees and the University Court may agree upon the respective holders of which chairs shall give instruction in medicine both clinical and systematic and in obstetrics and gynæcology. Provided that the Trustees shall be represented on the board of curators having the right of election or presentation to the chairs by two members whom they shall nominate. Provided further that the obligation on the Trustees to pay the said two sums of four hundred pounds per annum shall be subject to the foundation and the continuance of the said two chairs by the University and also of two other chairs founded or to be founded namely a chair of pathology or pathological anatomy and a chair

of surgery all at the Royal Infirmary Provided also that subject to any agreement or agreements made or to be made in pursuance of the section of this Order the marginal note of which is "Agreements" all classes to be taught by the holders of the said four chairs shall be open to students of the University without distinction of sex and that in the event of the instruction given by the professors occupying the said four chairs or any of them ceasing to be open to women the Trustees shall withdraw the payments to the University Court in respect of the said two chairs of medicine and obstetrics and gynæcology or either of them :

- (2) To make a grant not exceeding one thousand two hundred pounds sterling out of the trust fund either from the capital or income thereof as the Trustees may think fit to the Glasgow and West of Scotland Technical College for the institution of a women-students' common room and cloak room and other accommodation in the said institution Provided that the governors of the said technical college shall submit to the Trustees plans of such common room and other buildings which may be required to be erected and shall previous to the erection of the same obtain the approval of the Trustees thereto and any such common room which may be so provided shall be designated "the Muirhead Women Students' Common Room" :
- (3) To pay out of the income of the trust fund such sum as may be necessary to establish and maintain four scholarships of an annual value of not less than thirty-five pounds each to be called "the Muirhead Scholarships" at the said technical college to be held by women students at the said college for a period of four years from the date on which they are respectively granted The said scholarships shall be awarded by the Trustees subject to such terms and conditions as they may prescribe and agree with the governors of the said technical college from time to time The Trustees may add to the number of or increase the amount of such scholarships if they think fit and as they may agree with the governors

of the said technical college The Trustees may at their absolute discretion withdraw or cancel the said scholarships or some one or more of them at the end of a period of twelve years from the date of the institution thereof or continue them or some of them for such longer period as may be deemed expedient:

- (4) To pay out of the income of the trust fund such sums as may be necessary to establish and maintain a post-graduate scholarship for a woman medical graduate of fifty pounds per annum tenable for one year at each of the following hospitals—the Royal Samaritan Hospital for Women in Glasgow and the Royal Hospital for Sick Children in Glasgow — the said scholarships to be held subject to such terms and conditions as the Trustees may prescribe and agree with the authorities of the said hospitals respectively from time to time The Trustees may at their absolute discretion withdraw or cancel the said scholarships or either of them at the end of a period of twelve years from the date of the institution thereof or continue both or either of them for such longer period as may be deemed expedient:
- (5) The Muirhead Trustees may apply any surplus income arising from the trust fund for any of the purposes mentioned in the testamentary writings of the Truster so far as these are not inconsistent with the foregoing purposes.

Provision for deficit.

36. In the event of any deficit in the income of the trust fund in meeting the annual payments by the Trustees under the provisions of subsections (3) and (4) of the section of this Order the marginal note of which is "Application of trust fund" they shall diminish such annual payments proportionately.

Agreements

37. The Trustees may enter into and carry out agreements with the University the governors of the Glasgow and West of Scotland Technical College the governors of the Royal Samaritan Hospital for Women in Glasgow the governors of the Royal Hospital for Sick Children in Glasgow the managers of the Royal Infirmary and the governors of St. Mungo's College or any one or more of them or with any other body or person in relation to any of the purposes of this Order and for more effectually carrying out such purposes.

38. The costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the preparing for obtaining and confirming this Order or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid out of the Trust Fund. A.D. 1910.

I.—EXCERPT FROM HOLOGRAPH SETTLEMENT OR CODICIL OF DATE  
3RD MARCH 1888.

Maclay Writer 169 West George Street Glasgow Robert Goodwin Civil Engineer 58 Renfield Street Glasgow Thomas Russell Esq. of Ascog Alexander James Hardie Moffat Clerk to Wingate Birrell & Co. St. Vincent Place Glasgow Edward Gillespie Cashier to Wordie & Co. and residing at Chapelcroft Cambuslang and his wife Mrs. Edward Gillespie I direct them to apply all my means with the exceptions after indicated to the founding and maintaining an Institution for the instruction of Women in Physical and Biological Sciences (but not Theological) in fact an Institution much on the same lines as was Anderson's College before it became part of the Glasgow and West of Scotland Technical College but for the instruction of Women and to be managed as much as practicable by Women as Anderson's College was by men.

The Women Students to receive an education to fit them to become Medical Practitioners Dentists Electricians Chemists etc. For the benefit of Medical Education it may be well that the Institution be placed near the Glasgow Royal Infirmary or the South-Side Victoria Infirmary . . . . I do not wish my books sold but kept for the Institution.

CAMBUSLANG 1889.

I Henry Muirhead M.D. LL.D. Bushyhill on the consideration that I have all my life been very much indebted to the aid of Women—to my mother my wife my eldest sister Jeannie and her maiden daughters and seeing how small a share of real good solid and scientific Education has been accorded to Women I have been induced to Bequeath the greater portion of my savings for the purpose of erecting and partially endowing an Institution or College somewhat after the model of the old Andersonian for the Education of Women *by Women* as far as that can practically and judiciously be carried out I do not wish it to be called Victoria or Queen's (little has either done for poorer sisters) But since all the aforementioned Women bore the name of Muirhead I think it may be fitly named after them.

It strikes me that the new Constitution of Anderson's Medical School is not a bad model to go by though by-and-by including more Physical and Biological Science and as Anderson's is now placed close to the Western Infirmary ours might and should be placed in proximity to Victoria Hospital.

I have not named any Medical men as Trustees because (as yet) their trade unionism is opposed to Women entering the Medical Profession.

I do not wish Clergymen to have anything to do with the management of the College for creeds are the firmest fetters to intellectual progress and a man who cannot break loose from such himself is not the best hand to help others.

IV.—EXCERPT FROM GENERAL TRUST DISPOSITION AND SETTLEMENT OF  
DATE 30TH JULY 1890 INDORSED UPON SAID HOLOGRAPH SETTLEMENT.

I Henry Muirhead Granter of the foregoing settlement Hereby Assign Dispose and Convey all and sundry my whole Means and Estate to the Trustees therein named for the purposes therein specified and nominate the said Trustees (a majority being a quorum) to be my sole Executors and I confer upon said Trustees the whole powers privileges and immunities competent to Trustees and Executors by the law of Scotland including power to sell Feu or Lease or Excamb my Heritable Estate and I revoke my Settlement of date 16th March Eighteen Hundred and Sixty-Four.
