



CHAPTER lxxxii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to Bolton Burnley Oldham and Sheffield. [3rd August 1910.] A.D. 1910.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force. Orders in schedule confirmed.

WHEREAS the Borough of Bolton (herein-after referred to as "the Borough") is an Urban Sanitary District of which the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses acting by the council (herein-after referred to as "the Corporation") are the Urban Sanitary Authority and the unrepealed provisions of the Bolton Corporation Act 1905 (herein-after referred to as "the Local Act") are in force in the Borough;

And whereas Section 52 of the Local Act requires that every registered medical practitioner attending on or called in to visit any person within the Borough shall forthwith on becoming aware that such person is suffering from tuberculosis of the lung notify the same in the manner therein provided for and by subsection (8) of the said Section 52 it is provided that the provisions of the said Section shall cease to be in force within the Borough at the expiration of five years from the Eleventh day of August One thousand nine hundred and five unless they shall have been continued by Act of Parliament or by Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board and confirmed by Parliament which Order the Local Government Board were thereby empowered to make in accordance with the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875;

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Local Government Board for the issue of a Provisional Order to continue in force the provisions of Section 52 of the Local Act for a further period of ten years:

And whereas Section 45 of the Local Act requires that every registered medical practitioner attending on or called in to visit any person within the City shall forthwith on becoming aware that such person is suffering from tuberculosis of the lung notify the same in the manner therein provided for and by subsection (8) of the said Section 45 it is provided that the provisions of the said Section shall cease to be in force within the City at the expiration of seven years from the Fourteenth day of August One thousand nine hundred and three unless they shall have been continued by Act of Parliament or by Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board and confirmed by Parliament which Order the Local Government Board were thereby empowered to make in accordance with the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875;
