An Act for continuing several Acts for laying a Duty of Twopennies Scots, or One-sixth Part of a Penny Sterling, on every Pint of Ale, Beer, or Porter, that shall be vended or sold within the Town of Dumfries and Privileges thereof.

[6th May 1811.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Third Year of the Reign 3 G. 1. c. 6. of King George the First, intituled, An Act for laying a Duty of Two-pennies Scots, or One-sixth Part of a Penny Sterling, upon every Pint of Ale or Beer that shall be vended or sold within the Town of Dumfries, and Privileges thereof, for paying the Debts of the said Town; and for building a Church, and making a Harbour there: And whereas another Act was passed in the Tenth Year of the 10 G. 2. c.7. Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, An Act for continuing an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the First, for laying a Duty of Two-pennies Scots or One-sixth part of a Penny Sterling on every Pint of Ale or Beer that shall be vended or sold within the Town of Dumfries and Privileges thereof, for paying the Debts of the said Town, and for building a Church and making a Harbour there, and for laying a Duty on the Tonnage of Shipping, and a Duty on Goods imported and exported into and out of the Port of the said Town for the better repairing of the said Harbour: And 2 G. 3. c. 55. whereas another Act was passed in the Second Year of the Reign [Loc. & Per.]

of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for continuing and rendering more effectual an Act passed in the Tenth Year of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, "An Act for continuing an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the First, for laying a Duty of Two-pennies Scots or One-sixth part of a Penny Sterling on every Pint of Ale or Beer that shall be vended or sold within the Town of Dumfries and Privileges thereof, for paying the Debts of the said Town, and for building a Church and making a Harbour there, and for laying a Duty on the Tonnage of Shipping, and a Duty on Goods imported and exported into and out of the Port of the said Town for the better 27 G.3. c.57. repairing of the said Harbour:" And whereas another Act was passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for continuing and amending several Acts made in the Third Year of the Reign of King George the First, the Tenth Year of the Reign of King George the Second, and the Second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for laying a Duty of Two-pennies Scots or One-sixth Part of a Penny Sterling on every Pint of Ale or Beer that shall be vended or sold within the Town of Dumfries and Privileges thereof, for paying the Debts of the said Town, and for building a Church and making a Harbour there, and for laying a Duty on the Tonnage of Shipping and a Duty on Goods imported and exported into and out of the Port of the said Town, for the better repairing the said Harbour, and for paving cleansing, lighting and watching the Streets and other Public Places within the said Town, and widening the Streets where necessary, and removing and preventing Nuisances therein: And whereas the Yearly Amount of the said Duty and Imposition upon Ale, Beer and Porter, though managed with the greatest Frugality, has been found inadequate to pay off the Debts for which it was granted and continued, and by fundry useful and necessary Improvements in the said Town, the Debts thereof are considerably increased, and which the ordinary Revenues of the Town are not sufficient to discharge: May it therefore please Your Majesty, That it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Par-Two-pennies liament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after Scots on Ale, the End of the present Session of Parliament, the Rate, Duty, &c. contiand Imposition granted and made payable by the said former Asts, upon all Ale and Beer, Porter, Strong Ale and Strong Beer, that shall either be brewed or brought in or vended, tapped, or sold within the Town of Dumfries and Liberties thereof, shall be further continued, raised, levied, collected, paid and made payable to the Provost, Magistrates and Common Council of the said Town of Dumfries for the Time being, and to their Successors in Office, and to their Collectors and Assigns, for the Use and Behoof of the said Town for the

II. And be it further enacted, That the said Rate, Duty, and Imposition hereby continued, shall be raised, levied, and collected from the same Persons, and by the same Means and Methods, and under the same Penalties and Forfeitures, as in the faid former Acts contained; and that the Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council, shall be and continue Trustees for the Receipt and Application thereof, with the same Powers, and subject to the same Rules and Directions as are mentioned and prescribed

in the faid feveral Acts respectively; and the said Rate, Duty, and Imposition shall, after paying the Expences of the passing of this Act, be paid and applied to and for the same Uses and Purposes as are therein mentioned; and the said Acts, and every Article, Rule, Clause, Matter, and Thing therein contained, as far as the same are applicable, shall be of the same Force and Effect, to all Intents and Purposes, as if the said former Acts, and every Article, Rule, Clause, Matter, and Thing therein contained, were particularly and at large repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this present Act.

III. Provided always, and it is hereby enacted, That a Draw-Drawback back of the faid Duty shall be allowed and paid by the Provost, Ma-allowed on gistrates, and Town Council of the said Town of Dumfries, and their Ale, &c. exported out of Successors, Collectors, and Assigns, on all Ale and Beer, Porter, Strong the Town and Ale and Strong Beer, which shall be brewed within the said Town and Liberties. Liberties thereof, and which shall be proved to the Satisfaction of the said Provost, Magistrates, and Town Council of the said Town, and their Collectors and Assigns, to have been exported and sold to Persons living without the said Town, and the Liberties thereof, and not liable to the said Duty.

IV. And be it enacted, That William Johnstone Hope, Sir John Heron Max-Overseers of well Baronet, of Springkell, Sir Robert Lawrie, of Maxwellton, Baronet, Sir the Duty on Thomas Kirkpatrick, of Closeburn, Baronet, Patrick Miller of Dalswinton, Ale, &c. John Murray of Murraythwaite, Charles Sharpe of Hoddour, Henry Veitch of Elliock, Charles Grenville Stuart Mentieth of Closeburn, John Maitland of Eccles, William Irving of Gribton, and Robert Anderson of Stroquhan, shall be and are hereby appointed Overseers of the said Rate, Duty and Imposition hereby continued and granted, in place and stead of the Overseers appointed by the said recited Act of the Twenty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, and shall have and are hereby vested with the same Powers and under the same Regulations as are in and by the said before recited Acts granted and given to the said former Overseers.

V. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken Public Act. to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices and others, without being specially pleaded.

VI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall continue in force for Continuance. and during the Period of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
