An Act to enable the Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the City of Bristol to reduce, alter, modify, and regulate certain Dues called "Town Dues" and "Mayor's Dues," and for the charging and collecting thereof.

[6th July 1825.]

HEREAS the Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the City of Bristol are possessed of and claim to be entitled to certain Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money called The Town Dues," or "Town Duties," payable in respect of certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, (being the Property of Persons not free of the said City of Bristol, nor otherwise legally exempted from the Payment thereof), exported from or imported into the Port of Bristol to or from Foreign Parts beyond the Seas, and also to certain other Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money payable upon certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes exported from and imported to the Port of Bristol Coastwise or along the Coasts of Great Britain: And whereas the Mayor of the said City of Bristol for the Time being is possessed of and claims to be entitled to a certain Toll, Duty, or Sum of Forty Shillings, called "The Mayor's Dues," for and in respect of every Ship or Vessel above the Burden of Sixty Tons navigated and coming from any Port or Place without the Port of Bristol, and below the Islands called the Stipe Holme and the Flat Holme, and brought up the River Avon to either of the Quays or the Back of Bristol, or the . [Local.] 68~ZCanals,

Canals, Wharfs, Docks, or any other Places being Part and Parcel of the said Port of Bristol; which said Tolls or Duties respectively called "The Town Dues," or "Town Duties," are the same several Tolls and Duties as are respectively comprised in an Act passed in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act for improving and rendering more commodious the 43G.3.c.140. Port and Harbour of Bristol: And whereas the said Town Dues have been heretofore and hitherto payable and collected upon and in respect of the Export and Import of Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes from and to Bristol and Ireland respectively: And whereas the said Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty are desirous of relinquishing the said Coastwise Dues, and also of relinquishing the said Town Dues so far as the same Town Dues relate to Ireland; and are also desirous, and it is expedient that the said Town Dues, and also the said Mayor's Dues, should be reduced, altered, modified, and regulated in the Manner herein-after mentioned: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act, the said Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money payable upon Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, which may hereafter be imported or exported to and from the Port and City of Bristol Coastwise or along the Coast of Great Britain; and also the Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money called "The Town Dues," so far only as the said Town Dues relate to Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes exported from Bristol to any Port or Place in that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, or imported into Bristol from any Port or Place in Ireland, shall cease and be no longer payable.

Tolls on Goods Coastwise, and Town Dues on Goods exported and imported to and from Ireland, to cease.

Present Rates of Town and Mayor's Dues to cease, and others substituted.

II. And be it further enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act, the said Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money called "The Town Dues," and "The Mayor's Dues," as the same respectively have been heretofore payable, shall respectively cease and be no longer payable; but that in lieu thereof the several Tolls, Duties, and Sums of Money respectively set forth in the Schedules (A.) and (B.) hereunto annexed, that is to say, Schedule (A.) as and for and in lieu of the said Town Dues, except as aforesaid, and Schedule (B.) as and for and in lieu of the said Mayor's Dues, shall be and the same are hereby respectively substituted, and the same, except as aforesaid, shall be and are hereby respectively declared to be henceforth respectively payable to the said Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty, and the said Mayor for the Time being respectively, in as full and ample a Manner as the same have hitherto been and are now payable.

Dues may be reduced, altered, and modified.

III. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the said City of Bristol, in Common Council assembled, from Time to Time, as and when they may see fit, to reduce, alter, modify, and regulate, and after such Reduction, Alteration, Modification, or Regulation, again to raise and increase, and so from Time to Time to reduce, alter-

modify, regulate, and raise the Rate of the said several Tolls, Duties, and Sums of Money respectively set forth in the said respective Schedules, or any or either of them respectively, so that the Rate of the said respective Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money, or of any or either of them respectively, shall not be raised or increased beyond the Rate thereof set forth in the said respective Schedules.

IV. And be it further enacted, That upon any and every Alteration Notice thereof such Tolls, Duties, and Sums of Money, or any of them, being made, the same shall be notified by advertising the same not less than Twice in the London Gazette, and Twice in some Newspaper usually circulating in the said City of Bristol, Six Months at the least before such Alteration shall take Effect.

V. And be it further enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act, the several Tolls, Duties, and Sums of Money set forth and stated in the said several Schedules, and from and after any and every such Alteration, the said altered Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money, as the same may be from Time to Time altered in the Manner herein provided for and authorized, so far as such Alteration shall extend, but no further or otherwise, shall be respectively payable to the said Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the said City of Bristol, and to the said Mayor of the said City of Bristol for the Time being respectively, in as full and ample a Manner as the same have hitherto been and are now payable.

Dues schedulated or altered to be paid to the Mayor, &c.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the several Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money comprised in the said Schedule (A.) shall not be payable in respect of such Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes as are exempted bona fide the Property of, and bona fide exported or imported by or from Dues. on Account and Risk of Persons free of the said City of Bristol, or having any other legal Exemptions from the Payment thereof.

VII. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful Power to for the said Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty in Common Council assembled, to compound with the Owner or Owners of any Ship or Vessel liable to the Tolls or Duties set forth in the Schedule (B.) for Twelve Calendar Months, or for any less Portion of Time, prospectively; and upon Payment of the Sum agreed upon at the Time of entering into such Agreement, but not otherwise, the said Ship or Vessel shall be and the same is hereby declared to be discharged from the Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money for which the same would have been liable, for and during the Time covered by such Composition, if such Composition had not been so made.

VIII. Provided always, and it is hereby further enacted, That any No more than Ship or Vessel entering the Port of Bristol more frequently than Three Tolls Three Times within the Period of any Twelve Calendar Months, shall not be liable to pay the Tolls, Duties, or Sums of Money set forth though vesin the Schedule (B.) for such Entrance into the said Port, oftener than sels mayenter the said Three Times during the said Twelve Calendar Months, nor Port oftener. shall the same be demandable for or on account of any Ship or Vessel so entering.

Saving Rights.

IX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall in any Manner abridge, infringe, lessen, or alter any of the Rights, Privileges, Tolls, Dues, Duties, Powers, or Authorities of the Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the said City of Bristol, or any of the accustomed Rights and Privileges of the said City (save only as herein is enacted); any thing herein-before contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

Tolls, &c. authorized by this Act substituted for former Dues, and held in the same Manner.

X. Provided always, and be it enacted, That the Tolls, Duties, and Sums of Money comprised in the Schedules hereunto annexed, shall be deemed and taken to be severally substituted in lieu and place of the said respective Tolls and Dues called "The Town Dues," and "Mayor's Dues," as the same were respectively held, collected, and received before and at the passing of this Act; and that nothing in this Act contained shall be deemed or taken to affect or prejudice the Right or Title to the said Tolls and Dues called "The Town Dues" and "Mayor's Dues," which the said Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the City of Bristol, or the said Mayor for the Time being, had, possessed, or enjoyed before and at the passing of this Act, or to give to or confer on the said Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty of the said City of Bristol, or their Successors, or the said Mayor for the Time being, any other Right or Title to the said Duties and Sums of Money comprised in the Schedules hereunto annexed, than the said Mayor, Burgesses, and Commonalty, and the said Mayor for the Time being respectively, now have or had before and at the passing of this Act, to the Town Dues and Mayor's Dues in the Room and Place of which such Tolls, Duties, and Sums of Money are hereby respectively substituted; and that the Evidence relating to the Town Dues and Mayor's Dues, as the same were respectively held, collected, and received before and at the passing of this Act, shall not be affected by the Alteration hereby made in the Nature and Amount of the said Tolls or Dues, or by such further or other Reduction or Alteration as may hereafter be made by virtue of the Powers herein contained; any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others, without being specially pleaded. The State of the Contract of t
