



CHAPTER lxxvii.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State under the Public Health Act 1875 relating to Salford. A.D. 1925.
[31st July 1925.]

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks Baronet one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State has made the Provisional Order set out in the Schedule hereunto annexed under the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Order as set out in the Schedule hereunto annexed is hereby confirmed.

*Provisional Order for altering the Salford Corporation
Act 1920.*

To the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of
Salford :—

WHEREAS the unrepealed provisions of the Salford Corporation Act 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Act") are in force in the Borough of Salford and the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses acting by the Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") are the Local Authority within the said Borough for the purposes of the Local Act :

And whereas by Section 195 of the Local Act provision is made for the imposition of a penalty for keeping obscene pictures &c. for sale :

And whereas by virtue of subsection (5) of Section 195 of the Local Act the provisions of that section will cease to be in force on the Fifteenth day of August One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five unless they shall have been continued by Act of Parliament or by Provisional Order made by the Secretary of State and confirmed by Parliament which Order the Secretary of State is thereby empowered to make in accordance with the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875 relating to Provisional Orders amending local Acts and in the application of those provisions to the purposes of that Section the Secretary of State shall be substituted for the Local Government Board or the Ministry of Health :

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Secretary of State for the issue of a Provisional Order to continue in force the provisions of Section 195 of the Local Act for a further period :

Now therefore I the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks Baronet one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State in pursuance of the powers given to me by Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 as applied by subsection (5) of Section 195 of the Local Act and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf hereby order that from and after the date of

the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following A.D. 1925.
provisions shall take effect namely :—

ART. I. Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 195 of the Local Act the provisions of this Section shall be in force in the Borough until the Fifteenth day of August One thousand nine hundred and thirty and shall then cease to be in force unless they shall have been continued by Act of Parliament or by Provisional Order made by the Secretary of State and confirmed by Parliament.

ART. II. This Order may be cited as the Salford Order 1925. Short title.
