



CHAPTER xvii.

An Act to confirm a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners for the application or management of the charities called the Goldsmiths' Consolidated Charities.

A.D. 1932.

[16th June 1932.]

WHEREAS the Charity Commissioners in their report to His Majesty of their proceedings during the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one reported that they had approved and certified a Scheme for the application or management of the charities called the Goldsmiths' Consolidated Charities under the management of the Goldsmiths' Company of the City of London and regulated by a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners of the 15th March 1918 :

And whereas it is expedient that the Scheme as the same is fully set out and defined in the schedule to this Act should be confirmed :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :--

1. The said Scheme is hereby confirmed Provided always that nothing in this Act or in the said Scheme shall

Short title. 2. This Act may be cited as the Goldsmiths'
Consolidated Charities Scheme Confirmation Act 1932.

SCHEDULE.

A.D. 1932.

Scheme for the application or management of the charities called the Goldsmiths' Consolidated Charities under the management of the Goldsmiths' Company of the City of London and regulated by a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners of the 15th March 1918.

1. The trustees of the above-mentioned charities may make a grant of £50,000 to the University of London out of the capital endowments of the charities such grant to be applied towards defraying the cost of building and equipping a library for the said University.

2. If the said grant shall be made the said sum of £50,000 shall be raised by the sale of such investments belonging to the charities as the Charity Commissioners shall direct.
