

CHAPTER 1.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under the Private A.D. 1914. Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 relating to Clydebank and District Water. [8th July 1914.]

WHEREAS His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland has made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed under the provisions of the Private Legislation 62 & 63 Vict. Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899 and it is requisite that the said c. 47. Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

- 1. The Provisional Order contained in the schedule hereunto Confirmation of Order in annexed shall be and the same is hereby confirmed.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Clydebank and District Short title. Water Order Confirmation Act 1914.

SCHEDULE.

PROVISIONAL ORDER.

To extend the time for the completion of works authorised by the Clydebank and District Water Order 1910 to authorise the Clydebank and District Water Trustees to borrow additional money and for other purposes.

WHEREAS by the Cydebank and District Water and Burgh Extension Order 1906 (in this Order referred to as "the Order of 1906") the Clydebank and District Water Trustees (in this Order called "the Trustees") were incorporated for the purpose of supplying water within the Burgh of Clydebank and the district therein defined and were authorised to acquire lands and to construct the works therein described:

And whereas by the Clydebank and District Water Order 1909 (in this Order referred to as "the Order of 1909") the Trustees were authorised to construct additional works and to abandon certain authorised works and to acquire further lands for the purpose of their water undertaking and the time for the purchase of lands and the completion of the works authorised by the Order of 1906 was extended:

And whereas by the Clydebank and District Water Order 1910 (in this Order referred to as "the Order of 1910") the Trustees were amongst other things authorised to construct the additional works therein described:

And whereas it is expedient that the period limited by the Order of 1910 for the completion of certain of the works thereby authorised should be extended as by this Order provided:

And whereas the estimates for the construction of the works authorised by the Order of 1906 the Order of 1909 and the Order of 1910 have been found to be insufficient by the sum of sixty-eight thousand pounds:

And whereas it is expedient that the Trustees should be authorised to borrow the said sum of sixty-eight thousand pounds and also to borrow a further sum of twenty-two thousand

pounds for the purposes of their water undertaking as herein- A.D. 1914. after in this Order provided:

And whereas it is expedient that the other powers in this Order contained should be conferred on the Trustees:

And whereas the purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without an Order of the Secretary for Scotland confirmed by Parliament under the provisions of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1899:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers contained in the last-mentioned Act the Secretary for Scotland orders as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited for all purposes as the Clyde-Short and bank and District Water Order 1914 and may together with collective titles. the Order of 1906 the Order of 1909 and the Order of 1910 be cited as the Clydebank and District Water Orders 1906 to 1914.

2. This Order shall commence and have effect on and from Commencethe date of the passing of the Act confirming the same which ment of Order. date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Order."

3. The powers granted by the Order of 1910 for the Extension completion of the Works No. 3 No. 4 and No. 5 authorised by completion that Order are hereby extended and shall continue in force and of works. may be exercised by the Trustees for the further period of seven years from the third day of August one thousand nine hundred and seventeen and on the expiration of that period those powers shall cease except as to so much of the said works as are then completed.

4. In addition to any money which the Trustees have Additional borrowed or are authorised to borrow under the Order of 1906 borrowing the Trustees may from time to time borrow by way of mortgage or otherwise any sums not exceeding the following sums namely:

(A) For the completion of the Burncrooks Reservoir and the new filters at Cochno and for the construction of Works No. 3 No. 4 and No. 5 authorised by the Order of 1910 the sum of sixty-eight thousand pounds;

- (B) For the covering over of Kilbowie Reservoir and for additional service tank accommodation and for additional supply and service pipes the sum of twenty-two thousand pounds;
- (c) For paying the costs charges and expenses of and in relation to this Order and the confirmation of the same such sum as may be necessary for that purpose.

5. The estimate required to be made and the assessment and rates rents and charges authorised and required to be levied by the Trustees under and for the purposes of the Order of 1906 the Order of 1909 and the Order of 1910 shall be made and levied so that the same shall include and be sufficient with the other revenues of the Trustees not only for the purposes specified in the said Orders of 1906 1909 and 1910 but also for the purposes of this Order.

As to existing borrowing powers.

- 6. The provisions as to security repayment of borrowed moneys reborrowing borrowing on cash account sinking fund form of mortgage and appointment of a judicial factor and the other provisions contained in the Order of 1906 with reference to the sum therein authorised to be borrowed shall apply to the additional money authorised to be borrowed under this Order Provided always that the prescribed periods for repayment of any money to be borrowed under this Order shall be as follows (that is to say):—
 - (1) As to money borrowed for the purposes of Burncrooks Reservoir the new filters at Cochno the covering over of Kilbowie Reservoir and for additional service tank accommodation within fifty years from the date or dates of borrowing the same;
 - 2) As to money borrowed for Work No. 3 authorised by the Order of 1910 within forty years from the date or dates of borrowing the same;
 - (3) As to money borrowed for Works No. 4 and No. 5 authorised by the Order of 1910 and for additional supply and service pipes within thirty years from the date or dates of borrowing the same;
 - (4) As to moneys borrowed for the purpose of paying the costs charges and expenses of this Order as aforesaid within five years from the commencement of this Order.

7. All the costs charges and expenses of and incidental to A.D. 1914. the preparing for obtaining and confirming this Order or other-Costs of wise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Trustees out of Order. the rates to be levied by them or other revenue of the Trustees or from moneys borrowed and to be borrowed on the security of the same.
