

CHAPTER viii.

An Act to confer further powers on the Yorkshire A.D. 1918. Electric Power Company and to make further provisions with respect to the supply of electrical energy in the area of that Company. [27th June 1918.]

WHEREAS by the Yorkshire Electric Power Act 1901 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1901") the Yorkshire Electric Power Company (hereinafter called "the Company") were incorporated and authorised (amongst other things) to supply electrical energy within an area defined in that Act comprising the greater part of the west riding of the county of York and to provide generating stations at which the electrical energy required for supply within the said area could be produced:

And whereas by the Yorkshire Electric Power Acts 1910 and 1914 further powers have been conferred upon the Company:

And whereas it is expedient that the additional powers conferred by this Act should be granted:

And whereas the objects aforesaid cannot be attained without the authority of Parliament:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords [Price 3d.]

- A.D. 1918. Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—
- Short title.

 1. This Act may be cited as the Yorkshire Electric Power Act 1918.
- Interpretation.

 2. In this Act the expression "the area of supply of the Company" means the area of supply defined by section 40 of the Act of 1901.

Agreements as to constitution of joint committees and joint boards.

3. The Company on the one hand and any one or more of the local authorities of districts wholly or partly in the area of supply of the Company on the other hand may enter into provisional agreements for the constitution of a joint committee or joint board or otherwise for the joint exercise in the said area or any part thereof of all or any of the powers of the Company and of such local authority or authorities under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 to 1909 or this Act or any special Act or Provisional Order with reference to the generation and supply of electrical energy and the Board of Trade may with the concurrence of the Local Government Board by Provisional Order under the Electric Lighting Acts 1882 to 1909 confirm any such agreement and by such Provisional Order may make such provisions as may appear necessary or proper for giving effect to such agreement.

Agreements.

4. The Company on the one hand and any local authority company body or person authorised by Act of Parliament or Provisional Order confirmed by Parliament to supply energy within any part of the area of supply of the Company on the other hand may enter into and carry into effect contracts agreements and arrangements for the supply either by the Company or by such local authority company body or person separately or by the Company and such local authority company body or person jointly in the area of such local authority company body or person (so far as the same is within the area of supply of the Company) of energy plant fittings or materials and as to the prices to be charged for and the terms and conditions of such supply and the execution either by the Company or by such local authority company body or person separately or by the Company and such local authority company body or person

jointly of any works in reference to the supply or use of energy A.D. 1918. within the said area of supply of the Company and as to the division or allocation of expenditure in connexion therewith and the appropriation or division of receipts arising therefrom.

5. The costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the Costs of Act. preparing for obtaining and passing of this Act or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Company.
