



CHAPTER xxvii.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order of the Minister of Health relating to the City and County of the City of Exeter. [30th July 1948.]

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Public Health Act 38 & 39 Vict. 1875 the Minister of Health has made a Provisional ^{c. 55.} Order which needs confirmation by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Order of the Minister of Health which is set out in the Order in schedule to this Act is hereby confirmed and shall have full ^{schedule con-} validity and force. _{firmed.}

2. This Act may be cited as the Ministry of Health Provisional Short title. Order Confirmation (Exeter) Act 1948.

SCHEDULE.

CITY AND COUNTY OF THE CITY OF EXETER.

Provisional Order altering and partially repealing a local Act.

WHEREAS the mayor aldermen and citizens of the city and county of the city of Exeter acting by the council (in this order called "the Corporation") are the local authority for the said city for the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875:

And whereas under various powers conferred on them the Corporation maintain markets in the said city for the sale of live-stock and agricultural and horticultural produce and other commodities:

And whereas the Corporation are empowered by section XII of the statute 1 Geo. 4. c. lxxviii (in this Order called "the Act of 1820") to demand receive and take in respect of all live cattle and beasts which shall be brought to the said market tolls specified in the said section XII:

And whereas the Corporation are desirous of substituting new tolls and charges for the tolls specified as aforesaid and have applied to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to alter and partially repeal the Act of 1820 for the purposes aforesaid:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows:—

Short title and commencement.

1. This Order may be cited as the Exeter Order 1948 and shall come into operation on the date of the Act of Parliament confirming it.

Market tolls.

2. The Corporation may as respects the cattle market held by them under the Act of 1820 demand and take in respect of the matters mentioned in Schedules A and B to this Order tolls and charges not exceeding those specified therein.

Variation of tolls.

3. The Corporation may with the sanction of the Secretary of State from time to time alter or add to the tolls applicable to any market maintained by them and any such altered tolls shall as from the date on which they come into operation be substituted for the corresponding tolls applicable to any such market.

Tolls when to be paid.

4. Section XII (Tolls to be taken for live cattle) of the Act of 1820 is hereby repealed and references in section XIII (Tolls when to be paid) thereof to tolls shall be construed as references to the tolls and charges authorised under this Order.

The above tolls to be payable for every animal bird or article for each day in which the same is placed in the market whether for sale or not and whether sold or not.

Lairage for each 24-hour period or part of such period a charge equivalent to twice the toll payable in respect of the animal.

Animals or articles left in market For any animal or article upon which toll is payable brought to the cattle market on market days and left there after 6 p.m. a charge equivalent to the toll applicable to such animal or article shall be payable in respect of each 12-hour period or part of such period during which the animal or article remains in the market.
