VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

An Act to extend the Time for the Purchase of Lands required for the Completion of the Dublin and Belfast Junction Railway, and to amend the Acts relating to such Railway.

[17th May 1850.]

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Eighth and Ninth Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled An Act for making a Railway from Drogheda to 8 & 9 Vict. Portadown, with a Branch to Navan, several Persons were incor- c. 130. porated by the Name of "The Dublin and Belfast Junction Railway Company, with a Branch from Drogheda to Navan," for executing such Undertaking: And whereas the following Acts relating to such Company, the Name whereof is now "The Dublin and Belfast Junction Railway Company," have since been passed, that is to say, "The Dublin and Belfast Junction Railway Amendment Act, 1847," 10 & 11 Vict. and "The Dublin and Drogheda Railway (Purchase of Navan c.111. Branch) Act, 1847:" And whereas, by or under or in pursuance c. 180. of the Provisions of the said recited Acts, the Branch of the said Railway from Drogheda to Navan is made and completed, and has been [Local.] M mtransferred

transferred to the Dublin and Drogheda Railway Company, and a Part of the said Railway from Drogheda to Portadown has been made and opened to the Public: And whereas the Period limited by the said first-recited Act for the compulsory Purchase of Lands for the Purpose of making the said Railway and Works thereby authorized expired on the Twenty-first Day of July One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and the Period by the said Act limited for the Completion of the said Railway and Works will expire on the Twenty-first Day of July One thousand eight hundred and fifty, and it is expedient that further Time should be granted to the said Company for the compulsory Purchase of the Lands required for making the said Railway, so far as regards the Lands mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, and for completing the said Railway, and that some of the Provisions of the said recited Acts should be amended and enlarged; but the Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That in citing this Act in other Acts of Parliament and legal Instruments and Proceedings it shall be sufficient to use the Expression "The Dublin and Belfast Junction Railway Act Amendment, 1850."

Short Title.

Extending the Time for purchasing Lands.

II. And be it enacted, That the Time limited by the said first-recited Act for the compulsory Purchase of Lands for the Purpose of making the said Railway and Works thereby authorized shall, as regards the Lands mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, be and the same is hereby revived, extended, and enlarged until the Twenty-first Day of July One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and after such Day the Powers by the said first-recited Act and this Act granted for the compulsory Purchase of Lands for the Purpose of making the said Railway shall cease to be exercised.

Extending
Time for
Completion
of Works.

III. And be it enacted, That the Period limited by the said first-recited Act for the Completion of the Railway and Works thereby authorized shall be and the same are hereby accordingly extended for a Period of Seven Years from the passing of this Act.

Parties aggrieved by Extension of Time being granted, may have Compensation for additional Damage.

IV. Provided always, and be it enacted, That the Justices, Arbitrators, Umpires, or Juries respectively, as the Case may be, who, under the Provisions of the said first-recited Act or this Act, shall award or assess the Compensation to be made by the Company to the Owners or Occupiers of or other Persons interested in any of the Lands mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, for the Purchase of which the Period is by this Act extended, and which shall

be taken or used for the Purposes of the Railway or Works by the said first-recited Act or this Act authorized, or which may be injuriously affected by the Construction thereof, shall, in estimating the Amount of such Compensation, have regard to and make Compensation for the additional Damage (if any) sustained by such Owners, Occupiers, or other Persons, by reason of the Extension hereby authorized of the respective Periods aforesaid.

V. Provided also, and be it enacted, That the Extension hereby Existing authorized of the Periods aforesaid for the compulsory Purchase of Contracts and Notices Lands shall not in anywise prejudice or affect any Contract entered to take Lands into or Notice given by the said Company before the passing of this not to be Act for purchasing, taking, or using any Lands which under the said first-recited Act such Company is entitled to purchase, take, or use, but every such Contract and Notice respectively shall be construed and shall take effect, and the same Proceedings shall be had thereunder, and all Parties thereto shall be entitled to the same Rights and Remedies in respect thereof, both at Law and in Equity, as if such Extension of the said respective Periods had not been authorized as aforesaid.

VI. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Company Number of from Time to Time to vary the Number of Directors, provided that Directors may be the Number do not exceed Sixteen and be not less than Seven, any-varied. thing in the said first-recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

VII. Provided nevertheless, and be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be deemed or construed to abridge, alter, Rights of the Dublin and or prejudice or hinder the Exercise of all or any of the Powers of the Drogheda Dublin and Drogheda Railway Company, or of this Company, by or under or by virtue of the Powers contained in the Two last-recited Company Acts, but on the contrary, notwithstanding this Act, all such Powers may be exercised as if this Act had not been passed, anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

Rights of the Railway Powers of recited Acts.

VIII. And be it enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Deposits on Company, out of any Money by this Act or any other Act relating future Bills not to be paid to the said Company authorized to be raised for the Purposes of such out of the Act or Acts, to pay or deposit any Sum of Money which, by any Company's Standing Order of either House of Parliament now in force, or here- Capital. after to be in force, may be required to be deposited in respect of any Application to Parliament for the Purpose of obtaining an Act authorizing the said Company to construct any other Railway, or execute any other Work or Undertaking.

1X. And whereas an Act was passed in the Second Year of the Railway and Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to providé for the Company to be subject to Conveyance

Conveyance of the Mails by Railways; and another Act was passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of Her said Majesty, intituled An Act for regulating Railways; and another Act was passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of Her said Majesty, intituled An Act for the better Regulation of Railways, and for the Conveyance of Troops; and another Act was passed in the Eighth Year of the Reign of Her said Majesty, intituled An Act to attach certain Conditions to the Construction of future Railways authorized or to be authorized by any Act of the present or succeeding Sessions of Parliament, and for other Purposes in relation to Railways; and another Act was passed in the Ninth and Tenth Years of the Reign of Her said Majesty, intituled An Act for regulating the Gauge of Railways; and another Act was passed in the Ninth and Tenth Years of the Reign of Her said Majesty, intituled An Act for constituting Commissioners of Railways: Be it enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall be held to exempt the Company or their said Railway from the Provisions of the said several Acts respectively, but that such Provisions shall be in force in respect to the said Railway, so far as the same are applicable thereto.

Railway not exempt from Provisions of future general Acts.

X. Provided always, and be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to exempt the said Railway by this or the said recited Acts authorized to be made, from the Provisions of any general Acts relating to such Acts, or of any general Act relating to Railways, or to the better and more impartial Audit of the Accounts of Railways now in force, or which may hereafter pass during the present or any future Session of Parliament, or from any future Revision and Alteration under the Authority of Parliament, of the maximum Rates of Fares and Charges authorized by such Acts.

Expenses of Act.

XI. And be it enacted, That all the Costs, Charges, and Expenses incurred in applying for and obtaining this Act, or incident thereto, shall be paid by the said *Dublin and Belfast Junction* Railway Company out of the Money already raised and received, or out of the first Money to be raised or received by them, in preference to all other Payments whatsoever.

Public Act.

XII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such.
