An Act for extending and enlarging an Act passed in the Seventh Year of His late Majesty King *William* the Fourth, for making and maintaining a Turnpike Road from *Anniesland* Toll Bar in the County of *Lanark*; and for making and maintaining another Branch Road, to be called *Saint George's* Road, in connexion with said Road. [19th July 1839.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *William* the Fourth, intituled *An Act for making and maintaining a Turnpike Road from Anniesland Toll Bar to Saint George's Road and Branch Roads therewith connected, all in the County of Lanark*: And whereas an Act was passed in the First and Second Years of the Reign of His said late Majesty King *William* the Fourth, intituled *An Act for amending and making more effectual the Laws concerning Turnpike Roads*

in Scotland: And whereas it would be advantageous to the Public, and beneficial and convenient for the Inhabitants of the District through which the same will pass, if the following Road were made, maintained, and rendered Turnpike, and placed under the Care and Management of the Trustees appointed in virtue of the said recited Act for the Maintenance and Management of the said Road from *Anniesland* Toll Bar to *Saint George's* Road, and called the "Great Western Road," and Branch Roads therewith connected, and were maintained and managed in the same Manner as the Roads under their Care; *videlicet*, a Road commencing at a Point at or near the *Blackquarry* Toll Bar on the *Garscube* Turnpike Road, and extending in a South-west Direction to *Saint George's* Road, and thence, along, by, through, or near to that Road and *Woodlands* Road, to *Sauchyhall* Road, which Road will lead into and branch off from the Roads now under the Management of the said Trustees, and will pass through or into the Parish of *Saint George's* in the Royal Burgh of *Glasgow* and the Barony Parish of *Glasgow*, all in the County of *Lanark*, and is to be called "*Saint George's* Road:" And whereas the aforesaid Purposes cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said recited Act passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *William* the Fourth and the said recited Act passed in the First and Second Years of the Reign of His said late Majesty, and all and every the Powers, Provisions, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Payments, Remedies, Matters, and Things therein contained, (save and except such Parts thereof as are hereby expressly varied, altered, or repealed,) shall be as good, valid, and effectual for carrying this Act into execution as if the same had been repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this Act.

Powers of recited Acts extended to this Act.

Trustees appointed.

II. And be it enacted, That the said Road shall be made and maintained by and placed under the Care and Management of the Trustees appointed for making and maintaining the said Road from *Anniesland* Toll Bar to *Saint George's* Road called the Great Western Road, and Branch Roads therewith connected, who (or any Five of them, being a legal Quorum,) are hereby authorized to carry this Act into execution in such and the like Manner as they are authorized to put the first said recited Act into execution; and the said Road hereby authorized to be made, maintained, and rendered Turnpike shall be consolidated with and shall be deemed and taken to be a Part of the Roads authorized to be made and maintained by the Trustees of the

the Great Western Road, and Branch Roads therewith connected, under the said first-recited Act.

III. And be it enacted, That the First General Meeting of Trustees under this Act shall be held at *Glasgow* upon the Third *Wednesday* after the passing of this Act, or as soon thereafter as conveniently may be, and the said Trustees may then and there proceed to put this Act into execution.

First Meeting of Trustees.

IV. And be it enacted, That that Portion of the said Road hereby authorized to be made lying to the South of the said *Garscube* new Branch or City Road shall, in the first instance, be completed to the Breadth of Forty Feet only, including the Footpaths; but the said Trustees are hereby authorized at any Time thereafter to widen the same to the Breadth of Sixty Feet, including the Footpaths, with Consent of Two Thirds of the Proprietors on both Sides of the Line of *Saint George's* Road lying between *Buccleugh Street* and *Hill Street*, exclusive of all the Proprietors on the other Parts of the Line: Provided always, that that Portion of said Road lying to the North of said *Garscube* new Branch or City Road may be made of any Breadth the said Trustees may think fit, not exceeding Sixty Feet, including Footpaths.

Breadth of Road.

V. And be it enacted, That the Trustees of the said Road shall be and are hereby authorized and empowered to erect two Turnpike Gates across the said Road, and which shall be situated one to the South and the other to the North of the *Garscube* new Branch or City Road, but without the Power of erecting Side Bars across any of the Streets or Roads leading into that Part of *Saint George's* Road lying to the South of the said *Garscube* new Branch or City Road, without Prejudice nevertheless to the Power of erecting Side Bars on that Part of the said *Saint George's* Road lying to the North of the said *Garscube* new Branch or City Road; and to demand and take, or cause to be demanded and taken, by themselves or Tacksmen, at each of the said Two Turnpikes so to be erected, a Sum not exceeding the Rates and Duties specified in the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, before any Horse, Mule, Ass, Cattle, great or small, Coach, Landau, Chariot, Berlin, Chaise, Curricule, Omnibus, (or any other Carriage propelled by Steam,) Hearse, Chair, Calash, Litter, Waggon, Wain, Cart, Sledge, Hurley, Wheelbarrow, or other Carriage whatever, shall be permitted to pass through any such Gate or Turnpike, but with and under the Exemptions and Regulations described in the said first-recited Act.

VI. And be it enacted, That the Tolls and Duties hereby granted and made payable, together with the Right of Property of every Gate, Turnpike, or other Premises to be acquired by virtue of this Act, are and shall be vested in the said Trustees hereby appointed, or their said Quorum; and the said Tolls and Duties, and every Part thereof, shall be paid over and applied and assigned to and for the several Uses, Intents, and Purposes of this Act.

VII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That if the Trustees acting under the Authority of an Act passed in the Fifth and Sixth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *William* the Fourth, intituled *An Act for the altering the Line of Road from the Milnford of Garscube to the City of Glasgow, and improving the Roads leading therefrom into the said City*, shall make, complete, and maintain that Part of the Road hereby authorized to be made, extending from the *Blackquarry* Toll Bar to the Point of Junction of the Great Western or *Anniesland* Road and the *Garscube* new Branch or City Road, which they are hereby authorized to do, (the Consent of all the Creditors of the said *Glasgow* and *Garscube* Road being previously had and obtained thereto,) it shall be lawful for the Trustees acting under the Authority of this Act and they are hereby required to permit and suffer, and for the Trustees under the said Act of the Fifth and Sixth Year of His late Majesty to demand and take, upon the Portion of Road so to be made by them for the Purposes of the Trusts under the said last-mentioned Act and the Acts therein recited, the several Tolls hereby granted, so far as the same are exigible on such Portion of the said Road; and the said last-mentioned Trustees shall, in the event of their making the said Portion of the Road, have in relation thereto all the Powers, Remedies, and Privileges, and be subject to all the Provisions, as and to which the Trustees acting under this Act have and are subject to.

VIII. And be it enacted, That every Person who shall pay Toll at any Turnpike or Bar on any Part of the Road hereby authorized to be made, lying either to the South or to the North of the said Point of Junction on the said Road, shall be entitled to pass free through all the other Turnpikes and Bars to be placed thereon, and shall receive a Pass Ticket to that Effect; and in case, in virtue of the Powers in this Act contained, a Side Bar or Side Bars shall be erected across the old Road from *Woodside* to *Glasgow* commonly called the *North Woodside* Road, no Person or Persons passing along the said last-mentioned Road, and not using the Road by this Act authorized to be made otherwise than by crossing the same, shall be chargeable with the Tolls or Duties hereby authorized to be taken or levied.

IX. And

IX. And be it enacted, That the said Trustees, in General Meeting assembled, shall, after providing for the Expences incurred in obtaining this Act, apply the Monies to be raised in virtue of the said recited Acts and this Act, and the Tolls to arise or be levied at the Turnpike Gates erected or to be erected on the said Roads under their Charge, (excepting always the Tolls to be levied on the Portion of Road which the Trustees under the said Act of the Fifth and Sixth Year of His said late Majesty are hereby empowered to make in the event of their making the same,) first, towards the forming, making, completing, and keeping in repair and watching and lighting the said Roads and Bridges therewith connected, and putting this Act into execution; and thereafter towards the Payment of the Interest of the Sum or Sums subscribed or to be subscribed, borrowed, or advanced under and in virtue of this and the said recited Acts; and then to the Payment of the Principal Sum or Sums so subscribed, borrowed, or advanced for the Purposes aforesaid; and the Clerk to the said Trustees shall and is hereby authorized and required to record and enter all such Orders and Directions as regards the Application of such Monies in the proper Books of the Road Trust, which shall be at all Times accessible to the said Trustees.

X. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful to and in the Power of the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, at a General Meeting assembled, from Time to Time to direct such Part of the Tolls and Duties by this Act granted (excepting the Tolls to be levied on the Portion of the said Road which the Trustees under the said Act of the Fifth and Sixth Year of His late Majesty are hereby empowered to make in the event of their making the same) as they shall think proper, not exceeding One Fourth of the free annual Produce thereof in One Year, to be laid out and applied for the repairing of other Roads branching out of or leading into the said Roads.

XI. And it is hereby further enacted, That no Houses or other Buildings of any Description shall be erected within Thirty Feet from the Centre of the said Road called *Saint George's* Road hereby authorized to be made, or any of the Branch Roads under the same Trust, and leading into the Great Western Road.

XII. And be it enacted, That nothing herein contained shall alter or abridge the Powers, Provisions, and Enactments of the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King *William* the Fourth.

XIII. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.
