An Act for facilitating Arrangements with respect to the new Parish of *Saint Luke, King's Cross*, and other new Parishes and Districts, with a view to better Provision for the Cure of Souls within the original Limits of the Parish of *Saint Pancras* in the County of *Middlesex*; and for other Purposes.

[29th May 1868.]

WHEREAS by the *Midland Railway (Extension to London) Act, 1863*, the *Midland Railway Company* were empowered to construct a new Line of Railway in extension of their existing Railway, and to take for the Purposes thereof, among other Buildings and Lands in the Parish of *Saint Pancras* in the County of *Middlesex*, the Church of the new Parish of *Saint Luke, King's Cross*, (in this Act referred to as the Parish of *Saint Luke*,) formerly Part of the Parish of *Saint Pancras*, and the Site of that Church: And whereas by Section 83 of that Act (which is set out in the Schedule to this Act) the *Midland Railway Company* were required to pay Two Sums amounting in the whole to Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds to such Persons as should be agreed

on between the Company, the Vicar of *Saint Pancras*, and the Incumbent of the Parish of *Saint Luke*, the same to be applied by such Persons, together with the Interest accruing thereon, in the Purchase of a Site and in the Erection thereon, as in the Act provided, of a Church in lieu of the said Church of *Saint Luke*, with Liberty for the Application of any Surplus towards providing a Parsonage House or Schools, or both, to be attached to the new Church, and for the Application of any Part of the Interest arising from the said Sum in Payment of Liabilities affecting the existing Church, and in compensation to the Incumbent thereof: And whereas by Arrangement the said Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds has not been paid by the *Midland Railway Company*, but Interest thereon has been paid by them, and the Company have entered into Possession of and have taken down and removed the Church of the Parish of *Saint Luke*: And whereas a large Portion of the Parish of *Saint Luke* has been appropriated to Railway Purposes, and the Population of the Parish has been thereby considerably diminished: And whereas *George Moore*, of 15, *Kensington Palace Gardens* in the County of *Middlesex*, Esquire, has offered to erect a Church on a Plot of Ground which he has secured for the Purpose, situate in the District of *Somers Town* in the Parish of *Saint Pancras* which is adjacent to the Parish of *Saint Luke*, and has deposited with the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for *England* (in this Act referred to as the Commissioners) the Sum of Six thousand Pounds towards defraying the Expenses of the Erection of such Church: And whereas the Commissioners being of opinion that the whole Parish of *Saint Luke* may be conveniently incorporated in a District to be constituted and to be annexed to the Church so to be erected by the said *George Moore*, and that it is desirable that the Endowment attached to the Parish of *Saint Luke* be transferred to the Church so to be erected, and that a new Parish or District be constituted out of the new Parish of *Kentish Town* (formerly also Part of the Parish of *Saint Pancras*), or out of Cures adjacent thereto, with an Endowment of not less than Two hundred Pounds *per Annum*, being the same as that attached to the Parish of *Saint Luke*, and that the said Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds, or a competent Part thereof, should be applied in or towards the Provision of a Church, with a Parsonage House or Schools, or both, in such last-mentioned intended new Parish or District, and that in connexion with this Arrangement Provision should be made for the present Incumbent of the Parish of *Saint Luke*, it is expedient that the whole Arrangement aforesaid be carried into effect: And whereas the Objects aforesaid cannot be attained without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal,

Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; that is to say,

1. This Act may be cited as the *Saint Luke's (King's Cross) District Act, 1868.* Short Title.

2. The Commissioners in any Scheme or Representation submitted by them for Ratification by Order of Her Majesty in Council (in pursuance of any Act or Acts authorizing them in that Behalf) for constituting or assigning an Ecclesiastical District for or to the Church to be erected on the Site secured by the said *George Moore* as aforesaid (which intended District is in this Act called the *New Somers Town District*) may recommend and propose as follows; (that is to say,)

(1.) That the whole Parish of *Saint Luke* be comprised and included within the *New Somers Town District*:

(2.) That the Endowment or annual Payment now belonging to or receivable by the Incumbent of the Parish of *Saint Luke*, and all other Endowments and Emoluments (if any) to which such Incumbent may be entitled, be assigned and appropriated to the Incumbent for the Time being of the *New Somers Town District*:

(3.) That the Patronage of the *New Somers Town District*, and the Right of Nomination to the Church thereof, shall belong to and be absolutely vested in the said *George Moore*, his Heirs and Assigns.

3. On and after the Incorporation of the Parish of *Saint Luke* into the *New Somers Town District* the Reverend *Charles Henry Andrews*, the present Incumbent of the Parish of *Saint Luke*, shall *ipso facto* cease to hold such Incumbency.

4. On or so soon as may be after such Incorporation the Commissioners shall, with the Consent of the Bishop of the Diocese for the Time being, recommend and propose to Her Majesty in Council (in pursuance of the Act or Acts authorizing them in that Behalf) that a new Ecclesiastical District be constituted out of the new Parish of *Kentish Town*, or out of Cures adjacent thereto, (which intended new District is in this Act called the *New Kentish Town District*.) and shall provide for that District an Endowment of not less than Two hundred Pounds *per Annum*.

5. The Patronage of and Right of nominating a Minister to the *New Kentish Town District* shall belong to and be vested in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, and the Bishop of the Diocese for the Time being, and shall be exercised alternately, the first and every alternate Nomination being made by the First Lord Commissioner of

of Her Majesty's Treasury for and on behalf of the Crown: Provided that the said *Charles Henry Andrews*, if he is willing, shall be entitled to be the First Incumbent of the *New Kentish Town* District, and the Bishop of the Diocese may admit him thereto without any Form of or Fee for Presentation and Admission thereto, but in case he is not willing to accept the same, or if he accepts the same, then after the Avoidance by him of such Incumbency, the first or next Nomination (as the Case may be) thereto shall be made by the First Lord Commissioner of Her Majesty's Treasury for the Time being for and on behalf of the Crown.

6. In respect of such Time as elapses between the Date at which the said *Charles Henry Andrews* ceases to hold the Incumbency of the Parish of *Saint Luke*, and that at which he or some other Person becomes the Incumbent of the *New Kentish Town* District, the said *Charles Henry Andrews* shall receive from the Commissioners Payment at the Rate of Two hundred Pounds *per Annum*.

7. Notwithstanding anything in Section 83 of the *Midland Railway (Extension to London) Act, 1863*, the Reverend *William Weldon Champneys*, the Vicar of the Parish of *Saint Pancras*, or the Vicar thereof for the Time being, in conjunction with, until the Incorporation of the Parish of *Saint Luke* into the *New Somers Town* District, the said *Charles Henry Andrews*, or the Incumbent for the Time being of the Parish of *Saint Luke*, and in conjunction with, after such Incorporation, the said *Charles Henry Andrews*, or the Incumbent for the Time being of the *New Kentish Town* District, shall (subject to the Provision of this Act for Payment of the Costs, Charges, and Expenses of the passing of this Act), at any Time and from Time to Time after the passing of this Act, apply the said Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds, or a competent Part thereof, and the Interest thereof, to the Satisfaction of the Bishop of the Diocese for the Time being, and of the Commissioners, in the Manner and in the Order following; (that is to say,)

- (1.) In the Purchase, if necessary, of an appropriate Site for and in providing and fitting up a Church for the *New Kentish Town* District:
- (2.) If in the Judgment of such Vicar and Incumbent any Surplus will remain, after defraying the Costs of purchasing such Site and providing and fitting up such Church, then in or towards the Purchase, if necessary, of an appropriate Site for and in providing a Parsonage House or Schools, or both, for the same District.

8. The joint Receipt of the Vicar for the Time being of the Parish of *Saint Pancras* and of the Person for the Time being in conjunction

conjunction with whom he is by this Act directed to apply the said Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds in manner aforesaid shall discharge the *Midland* Railway Company from the said Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds, and all Interest thereon, and from being bound to see to the Application or being responsible for Loss on Non-application thereof, and the Company shall pay the same Sum and Interest to such Vicar and other Person as aforesaid on their joint Receipt accordingly, notwithstanding anything in Section Eighty-three of the *Midland* Railway (Extension to *London*) Act, 1863.

9. Except as in this Act expressly provided, nothing in this Act shall affect Section Eighty-three or any other Provision of the *Midland* Railway (Extension to *London*) Act, 1863.

Saving for Midland Company's Act.

10. The Costs, Charges, and Expenses preliminary to and of and incidental to the preparing, applying for, obtaining, and passing of this Act shall be paid out of the said Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds.

Section Eighty-three of the Midland Railway (Extension to London) Act, 1863 :

Within Three Months after the passing of this Act the Company shall pay the Sum of Six thousand two hundred and fifty Pounds, and within Six Months after the passing of this Act the further Sum of Six thousand two hundred and fifty Pounds, to such Persons as shall be agreed upon between them, the Vicar of Saint Pancras, and the Incumbent of the Ecclesiastical District of Saint Luke, Saint Pancras, to be applied by such Persons, together with the Interest accruing thereon, in the Purchase of an appropriate Site to be approved of by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and the Bishop of London, and in the Erection thereon by the said Vicar and Incumbent, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners and of the said Bishop, of a Church in lieu of or in substitution for the Church of Saint Luke, Euston Road, in the Parish of Saint Pancras aforesaid, and numbered on the Plan and in the Book of Reference in this Act referred to 137 in the said Parish, and for the Purposes aforesaid the said Vicar and Incumbent shall be entitled to the Pews and all the Fittings of every kind whatsoever which are or shall be in and upon the said Church of Saint Luke, and it shall be lawful for them to remove the same for such Purposes: Provided that the said Church and the Approaches thereto shall not be interfered with by the Company for Three Years from the passing of this Act, unless in the meanwhile such other Church shall have been erected and consecrated, and after the Expiration of such Period of Three Years, or upon such Consecration, whichever shall first happen, the Company may, if they think fit, remove the existing Church, and subject to this Restriction the said Church and the Site thereof shall, on full Payment by the Company of the said several Sums of Six thousand two hundred and fifty Pounds and Six thousand two hundred and fifty Pounds, making together the Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds, to such Persons as aforesaid, become vested in the Company without any further Conveyance or Assurance, discharged from all Trusts affecting the same under the Church Building Acts, or other Acts relating thereto: Provided also, that the new Church so to be erected by the said Vicar or Incumbent shall for all Purposes whatsoever, whether with respect to Endowment, Right of Presentation, or otherwise, be deemed to be in substitution for the existing

existing Church of Saint Luke in the said Parish: Provided also, that in case there shall be any Surplus of the said Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds, after answering the Purposes aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the said Vicar and Incumbent to apply such Surplus in any Manner they may think fit towards providing at their Discretion a Parsonage or Schools, or both, to be attached to the said Church: And further, that it shall be lawful for the said Vicar and Incumbent from Time to Time to apply any Part of the Interest arising from the said Sum of Twelve thousand five hundred Pounds, or from so much thereof as shall for the Time being remain unapplied as aforesaid, in the Payment of any Liabilities incurred in the Erection and Fittings of the said existing Church, and also, with the Consent in Writing of the Bishop of London, from Time to Time to pay any Portion of such Interest to the said Incumbent as and by way of Compensation for any Loss which in the Opinion of the said Bishop he may have sustained in consequence of this Act.
