

An Act to amend the "Ross Improvement Act, 1865."

A.D. 1869.

[12th July 1869.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the twenty-eighth and twenty- 28 & 29 Vict. ninth years of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act c. cviii. "for more effectually paving, lighting, and improving the town " of Ross in the county of Hereford; for maintaining and providing "markets within such town; and for supplying the same with "water; and other purposes:"

And whereas it was intended to incorporate with the said Act 10 & 11 Vict. "The Towns Police Clauses Act, 1847," but such incorporation c. 34. was inadvertently omitted, and it is expedient that the omission should now be supplied; but the same cannot be effected without the authority of Parliament:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. "The Towns Police Clauses Act, 1847," (except sections 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 16, and except where expressly varied by the c. 34. "Ross Improvement Act, 1865,") shall be deemed and construed incorporated. to be incorporated with and form part of the "Ross Improvement Act, 1865."

Parts of 10 & 11 Vict.

2. The several words and expressions to which meanings are Interpretaassigned by the "Towns Police Clauses Act, 1847," shall in the terms. "Ross Improvement Act, 1865," as amended by this Act, have the same respective meanings, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction. In the "Towns Police Clauses Act, 1847," for the purposes of this Act, the expression "the special Act" shall mean the "Ross Improvement Act, 1865;"

and the words "superintendent constable" and "constables" shall respectively mean the superintendent constable and constables acting within the town, and appointed under the Act 19 and 20 Vic. c. 69., or any other Act relating to the establishment and appointment of district or parish constables, or appointed by the justices of the county.

Short title.

3. This Act may be cited for all purposes as "Ross Improvement Act (Amendment Act), 1869."
