CHAPTER xliv.

An Act to empower the County Councils of the Adminis- A.D. 1899. trative Counties of Middlesex and Surrey to raise further moneys for the purposes of the Kew Bridge Act 1898.

[20th June 1899.]

HEREAS by the Kew Bridge Act 1898 (in this Act referred to as "the Act of 1898") the County Council for the administrative county of Middlesex and the County Council for the administrative county of Surrey (in this Act referred to as "the Councils") were empowered to construct a new bridge on the site of the existing Kew Bridge and other works and exercise other powers and to expend and borrow for the purposes of the said Act such money as they might from time to time think fit not exceeding as regards the county of Middlesex the sum of seventy-five thousand pounds and not exceeding as regards the county of Surrey the like sum:

And whereas it has been found that the sums so authorised to be expended and borrowed by the Councils will not be sufficient for carrying out the works authorised by the Act of 1898 and it is expedient that the Councils should be authorised to expend and borrow further moneys for those purposes as provided by this Act:

And whereas estimates have been prepared as to the sums required to be expended for the purposes of this Act and such estimates amount to fifty thousand pounds:

And whereas the objects aforesaid cannot be effected without the authority of Parliament:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):--

1. This Act may be cited as the Kew Bridge Act 1898 Short title. Amendment Act 1899 and the Act of 1898 and this Act may be cited together as the Kew Bridge Acts 1898 and 1899.

- 2.—(1.) Section thirty-eight of the Act of 1898 shall be read and construed as if the words "one hundred thousand pounds" had been substituted therein for the words "seventy-five thousand pounds" wherever the last-mentioned words occur in the said section.
- (2.) In addition to any other moneys which the Councils are by the Act of 1898 as amended by this Act authorised to borrow they may respectively with the consent of the Local Government Board borrow for the purposes of the Act of 1898 such sums of money as may be required as if such purposes had been purposes mentioned in section sixty-nine of the Local Government Act 1888 Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in that Act the provisions of section thirty-eight of the Act of 1898 shall apply to the borrowing of moneys under this sub-section and to the Councils respectively in relation thereto. The Councils shall severally make provision for the repayment of any money borrowed on capital account under this sub-section within a period not exceeding sixty years from the date of the borrowing of such money.

Expenses of Act.

3. The costs charges and expenses preliminary to and of and incidental to the preparing applying for obtaining and passing of this Act as taxed by the taxing officer of the House of Lords or of the House of Commons shall be borne by the Councils respectively in equal moieties and shall be defrayed by the said Councils respectively as payments for general county purposes within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1888.
