



## CHAPTER 35.

An Act to amend the Bills of Sale Act, 1890.

A.D. 1891.

[21st July 1891.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Section one of the Bills of Sale Act, 1890, shall be amended Exemption of so as to read as follows: An instrument charging or creating any securities on security on or declaring trusts of imported goods given or executed imported goods from at any time prior to their deposit in a warehouse, factory, or store, 41 & 42 Vict. or to their being reshipped for export, or delivered to a purchaser c. 31. and not being the person giving or executing such instrument, shall not c. 43. be deemed a bill of sale within the meaning of the Bills of Sale Acts, 1878 and 1882.

2. This Act may be cited as the Bills of Sale Act, 1891.
