



## CHAPTER 44.

An Act to amend the Law relating to the Judicial A.D. 1895. Committee of Her Majesty's Privy Council.

[6th July 1895.]

DE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and D with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1.—(1.) If any person being or having been Chief Justice or a Provision as to Judge of the Supreme Court of the Dominion of Canada, or of a persons being Superior Court in any province of Canada, of any of the Australasian or having been Colonial Chief colonies mentioned in the schedule to this Act, or of either of the Justices or South African colonies mentioned in the said schedule, or of any Judges. other Superior Court in Her Majesty's Dominions named in that behalf by Her Majesty in Council, is a member of Her Majesty's Privy Council, he shall be a member of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council.

- (2.) The number of persons being members of the Judicial Committee by reason of this Act shall not exceed five at any one
- (3.) The provisions of this Act shall be in addition to, and shall not affect, any other enactment for the appointment of or relating to members of the Judicial Committee.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Judicial Committee Amendment Short title. Act, 1895.
