#### Ministers and their staff

# 44 The [<sup>F1</sup>Scottish Government].

- (1) There shall be a [<sup>F1</sup>Scottish Government], whose members shall be—
  - (a) the First Minister,
  - (b) such Ministers as the First Minister may appoint under section 47, and
  - (c) the Lord Advocate and the Solicitor General for Scotland.
- (2) The members of the [<sup>F1</sup>Scottish Government] are referred to collectively as the Scottish Ministers.
- (3) A person who holds a Ministerial office may not be appointed a member of the [<sup>F1</sup>Scottish Government]; and if a member of the [<sup>F1</sup>Scottish Government] is appointed to a Ministerial office he shall cease to hold office as a member of the [<sup>F1</sup>Scottish Government].
- (4) In subsection (3), references to a member of the [<sup>F1</sup>Scottish Government] include a junior Scottish Minister and "Ministerial office" has the same meaning as in section 2 of the <sup>M1</sup>House of Commons Disqualification Act 1975.
