1999 CHAPTER 19

2 Approval of certain company names.

- (1) Before determining under [^{F1}section 55 of the Companies Act 2006] whether to approve the registration of a company under a name which includes—
- (a) the expression “chamber of commerce” or “siambr fasnach”, or
 - (b) any other expression for the time being specified in regulations under [^{F2}that section] which begins with the words “chamber of” or “chambers of” (or the Welsh equivalents),

the Secretary of State must consult at least one relevant representative body.

- (2) The Secretary of State may publish guidance with respect to factors which may be taken into account in determining whether to approve the registration of a name to which this section applies.
