## Further court proceedings

## 28 [<sup>F1</sup>Offender or parent referred back to court: offender] convicted while subject to referral order.

Schedule 1 to this Act, which-

- (a) in [<sup>F2</sup>Parts 1 and 1ZA] makes provision for what is to happen when a youth offender panel refers an offender back to the appropriate court, and
- [<sup>F3</sup>(aa) in Part 1A makes provision for what is to happen when a youth offender panel refers a parent or guardian to the court under section 22(2A) above, and]
  - (b) in Part II makes provision for what is to happen when an offender is convicted of further offences while for the time being subject to a referral order,

shall have effect.
