MISCELLANEOUS AND GENERAL

General

44 Orders, regulations and directions

- (1) A power of the [^{F1}Welsh Ministers] to make an order or regulations under this Act is exercisable by statutory instrument.
- (2) An order or regulations made by the [^{F1}Welsh Ministers] under this Act may—
 - (a) make different provision for different purposes;
 - (b) make consequential, incidental, supplemental, transitory, transitional or saving provision.
- (3) ^{F2}.....
- (4) A direction given under this Act—
 - (a) may be amended or revoked by the person who gave it;
 - (b) may make different provision for different purposes.
