EXEMPTED SUBSTANCES

Food

Any substance which—

7

- (a) is ordinarily consumed as food, and
- (b) does not contain a prohibited ingredient.

In this paragraph—

[^{F1}"enactment" includes—

- (a) an enactment contained in subordinate legislation;
- (b) an enactment contained in, or in an instrument made under, an Act of the Scottish Parliament;
- (c) an enactment contained in, or in an instrument made under, a Measure or Act of the National Assembly for Wales;
- (d) an enactment contained in, or in an instrument made under, Northern Ireland legislation;]
- "food" includes drink;

"prohibited ingredient", in relation to a substance, means any psychoactive substance—

- (a) which is not naturally occurring in the substance, and
- (b) the use of which in or on food is not authorised $[F^2$ by an enactment].
