1909 CHAPTER 40 9 Edw 7

An Act to amend the Metropolitan Police Acts 1829 to 1899, and to make better provision for the widows and children of constables who lose their lives in the execution of their duty.

[25th November 1909]

1 Annual contribution towards expenses of metropolitan police.

In addition to the sums payable out of moneys provided by Parliament for specified services of the metropolitan police, and as salaries under the MI Metropolitan Police Act 1899, there shall be paid in each year out of moneys provided by Parliament in respect of services rendered by the metropolitan police for imperial and national purposes such sum as the Secretary of State, with the approval of the Treasury, may determine.
