

Parliamentary Elections (Ireland) Act 1823

1823 CHAPTER 55

LXXI Return Writ to contain Certificate of Numbers who voted for respective Candidates.

And be it further enacted, That in every Case in which Poll shall take place at any Election for any County of a City or County of a Town in *Ireland*, the Returning Officer shall certify in his Return to the Writ for holding such Election the Names of the Candidates, and the Numbers who voted for each Candidate, as it appeared at the final Close of the Poll, and such Certificate shall be admitted as Evidence of the Truth of the Facts therein certified, unless disproved by contrary Evidence.
