4 Enacting words.

- (1) In every Bill presented to His Majesty under the preceding provisions of this Act, the words of enactment shall be as follows, that is to say:—

“Be it enacted by the King’s most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Commons in this present Parliament assembled, in accordance with the provisions of [^{F1}the Parliament Acts 1911 and 1949] and by authority of the same, as follows.”

- (2) Any alteration of a Bill necessary to give effect to this section shall not be deemed to be an amendment of the Bill.
