Bail and Remand

19 [F1Continuous bail.

Where a person is remanded on bail [F2the court may, where it remands him on bail in criminal proceedings (within the meaning of the MBail Act 1976) direct him to appear or, in any other case, direct that his recognizance be conditioned] for his appearance at every time and place to which during the course of the proceedings the hearing may be from time to time adjourned, without prejudice, however, to the power of the court to vary the order at any subsequent hearing.]
