

# "Anzac" (Restriction on Trade Use of Word) Act 1916

1916 CHAPTER 51 6 and 7 Geo 5

### 1 Prohibition of the use of the word Anzac in connection with any trade, &c.

- (2) If any person acts in contravention of this Act he shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and liable on conviction under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts to a fine not exceeding [<sup>F2</sup>£25][<sup>F2</sup>level 3 on the standard scale] or in the case of a second or subsequent conviction not exceeding [<sup>F3</sup>one hundred pounds][<sup>F3</sup>level 3 on the standard scale]; and when a company or society is guilty of any such contravention, without prejudice to the liability of the company or society, every director, manager, secretary, or other officer of the company or society who is knowingly a party to the contravention, shall be guilty of an offence against this Act and liable to the like penalty.
