SCHEDULE

OFFENCES REFERRED TO IN S. 3

- 3 In the application of the said section three to England and Wales and to Northern Ireland, the expression “offence against property” means any offence punishable under any of the following enactments, that is to say:—
- (a) ^{F1}
 - (b) the ^{M1}Malicious Damage Act, 1861;
 - (c) section thirteen of the ^{M2}Debtors Act, 1869, and section thirteen of the ^{M3}Debtors Act (Ireland), 1872 (which relate respectively to the obtaining of credit by false pretences and to certain frauds on creditors);
 - (d) ^{F1}
 - (e) ^{F1}
 - (f) section twenty-eight of the ^{M4}Road Traffic Act, 1930, and section four of the ^{M5}Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland), 1930 (which relate respectively to the taking of a motor vehicle without the owner’s consent.)
 - [^{F2}(g) the ^{M6}Theft Act 1968, except section 8 (robbery)];
 - [^{F3}(g) the ^{M7}Theft Act (Northern Ireland) 1969, except section 8 (robbery)];
 - [^{F4}(h) the Criminal Damage (Northern Ireland) Order 1977.]
 - [^{F5}(h) the ^{M8}Criminal Damage Act 1971.]
 - [^{F6}(i) an offence under section 2 of the ^{M9}Explosive Substances Act 1883 of causing an explosion likely to cause serious injury to property in connection with such an attack as is mentioned in section 1(1)(b) of the Internationally Protected Persons Act 1978.]
 - [^{F7}(j) the Theft Act 1978; [^{F8}and the Theft (Northern Ireland) Order 1978]]
 - [^{F9}(k) an offence under section 2 of the Nuclear Material (Offences) Act 1983, where the circumstances are that—
 - (i) in the case of a contravention of subsection (2), the act falling within paragraph (a) or (b) of that subsection would, had it been done, have constituted an offence falling within the foregoing subparagraphs, or
 - (ii) in the case of a contravention of subsection (3) or (4), the act threatened would, had it been done, have constituted such an offence.]
 - ^{F10}[(l) an offence under section 2 of the Explosive Substances Act 1883 of causing an explosion likely to cause serious injury to property in connection with such an attack as is mentioned in section 2(1) of the United Nations Personnel Act 1997.]
