

Cemeteries Clauses Act 1847

1847 CHAPTER 65 10 and 11 Vict

Protection of cemetery

59 Penalty on persons committing nuisances in the cemetery.

Every person who shall play at any game or sport, or discharge firearms, save at a military funeral, in the cemetery, or who shall wilfully and unlawfully disturb any persons assembled in the cemetery for the purpose of burying any body therein, or who shall commit any nuisance within the cemetery, shall forfeit FI . . . for every such offence a sum not exceeding $[^{F2}[^{F3}\pounds 10]][^{F2}]$ evel 1 on the standard scale].
