CHAPTER 27

EVIDENCE (SCOTLAND) ACT 1852

- I Witnesses not to be excluded by reason of Crime, &c. Right to examine Witnesses as to Credibility not affected. Not competent to adduce as a Witness any Person who shall be acting as an Agent in the Action. Where any Person adduced has been an Agent no Plea of Confidentiality allowable.
- II Party to an Action may be adduced as a Witness, unless it be shown that he has a substantial Interest.
- III Witness may be examined as to having made a different Statement.
- IV Witness may be recalled, after Examination.
- V Laws and Practice inconsistent with this Act repealed.
