



# London Hackney Carriage Act 1853

1853 CHAPTER 33 16 and 17 Vict

## 18 Power to police, magistrates or Justices of the Peace to hear and determine offences.

It shall be lawful for [<sup>F1</sup>two justices of the peace] to hear and determine all offences against the provisions of this Act, and also all disputes or causes of complaint that may arise out of the same; <sup>F2</sup> . . . <sup>F3</sup> . . . . . <sup>F4</sup> .
