An Act to consolidate and amend the Statute Law of England and Ireland relating to Accessories to and Abettors of indictable Offences. [6th August 1861]

AS TO ABETTORS IN MISDEMEANORS:

8 Abettors in misdemeanors.

Whosoever shall aid, abet, counsel, or procure the commission of $[^{F2}$ any indictable offence], whether the same be $[^{F2}$ an offence] at common law or by virtue of any Act passed or to be passed, shall be liable to be tried, indicted, and punished as a principal offender.
