

Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act 1840

1840 CHAPTER 113 3 and 4 Vict

27 Qualification of deans, archdeacons, and canons.

No person shall hereafter be capable of receiving the appointment of dean ^{F1}... [^{F2},] archdeacon, or canon, until he shall have been six years complete in [^{F3}holy orders and, in the case of a dean ^{F1}... or archdeacon, be in priest's orders at the time of the appointment], except in the case of a canonry annexed to any professorship, headship, or other office in any university.
