CHAPTER 24

CAPITAL PUNISHMENT AMENDMENT ACT 1868 (REPEALED)

- 1 Short title.
- 2 Executions to be within prison.
- 3 Sheriff, &c., to be present. Justices may be present, and other persons may be admitted.
- 4 Certificate of death.
- 5 Coroner's inquest on body.
- 6 Burial of body, within walls of prison, or, in certain cases, elsewhere.
- 7 Power to Secretary of State to make rules.
- 8 Such rules to be laid before Parliament.
- 9
- 10 Publication of certificate and inquisition.
- 11 Execution of duties and powers of sheriff, gaoler, &c. by under-sheriff, deputy gaoler, &c.
- 12 Forms in schedule to be used.
- 13 Application to Scotland.
- 14
- 15 Saving.
- 16 Sentence to be carried out as heretofore.
