1878 CHAPTER 71 41 and 42 Vict

An Act to extend to Metropolitan Commons certain provisions of the Commons Act, 1876. [16th August 1878]

1 Short title.

This Act shall be cited as the Metropolitan Commons Act 1878, and shall be read as forming one Act with the MI Metropolitan Commons Acts 1866 and M2 1869.

2 Power to Metropolitan Board to acquire and hold common rights.

[FIA London borough shall, in respect of any common the whole or part of which is situate within the borough,] have the same power to purchase and hold, with a view to prevent the extinction of the rights of common, any saleable rights in common, or any tenement of a commoner having annexed thereto rights of common, as is conferred by the fifth paragraph of the eighth section of the M3Commons Act 1876 upon [F2a district council] in respect of a suburban common.
