



Metropolitan Police (Receiver) Act 1895

1895 CHAPTER 12

An Act to make provision for the temporary absence of the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District. [14th May 1895]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Power to provide for temporary absence of receiver.

If and whilst the receiver for the metropolitan police district is temporarily absent from his duties a person appointed by warrant under the hand of the Secretary of State may temporarily act as and shall be deemed for all purposes to be such receiver.

2 Short title.

This Act may be cited as the Metropolitan Police (Receiver) Act, 1895, and shall be read with the Metropolitan Police Acts, 1829 to 1890.
