LIBEL ACT 1843

Offer of an apology admissible in evidence in mitigation of damages. In an action against a newspaper for libel, the defendant may plead that it was inserted without malice and without neglect, and may pay money into court as amends. False defamatory libel punishable by imprisonment and fine; 5 Malicious defamatory libel, by imprisonment or fine. Proceedings upon the trial of an indictment or information for a defamatory libel. Double plea. Proviso as to plea of not guilty in civil and criminal proceedings. Evidence to rebut primâ facie case of publication by an agent. 9 Interpretation of Act. 10 †Commencement and extent of Act.
