6 Provisions as to previous Acts.

(1) This Act shall apply to all criminal proceedings [F1 including proceedings in courts-martial][F2 under the M1 Army Act 1955 and the M2 Air Force Act 1955, and proceedings in courts-martial F3... under the M3 Naval Discipline Act 1957][F4 and in Standing Civilian Courts established under the M4 Armed Forces Act 1976], [F5 notwithstanding any enactment in force at the commencement of this Act,]...
