### 7 Amendments of 54 & 55 Vict. c. 38.

- $(1) \dots {}^{F_1}$
- (2) Any document referring to any Act or enactment repealed by the <sup>MI</sup>Stamp Act 1891, shall unless the context otherwise requires be construed to refer to that Act or the corresponding enactment in that Act.
- $(3) \ldots F^2$
- (4) The expression "instrument" in section nine of the <sup>M2</sup>Stamp Act 1891, includes any postal packet within the meaning of the [<sup>F3</sup>Postal Services Act 2000], and sub-section two of the said section is hereby repealed.
- - (6) Section twenty-four of the <sup>M3</sup>Stamp Duties Management Act 1891, is hereby declared to apply to affidavits and oaths as well as to statutory declarations.
