23	Clerk of Parliament to return to Treasury or to commissioners an
	account of fines set in the House of Lords;
24	and pay fines received as Treasury shall direct.
25	Clerk of House of Commons to make return of all recognizances.
26	Account of fines in King's Bench, Common Pleas, and Exchequer to be transmitted to Treasury and to commissioners of audit.
27	Unpaid fines to be estreated.
28	Fines, &c. received to be paid as Treasury shall direct.

30	Where fines, &c. are now estreated upon oath, such oath may be taken before a judge, &c.
31	Accounts of estreats to be transmitted to Treasury and to commissioners of audit.
32	Process to be issued every term, or oftener, to levy estreats.
