



## Fines Act 1833 (repealed)

1833 CHAPTER 99 3 and 4 Will 4

### 25 Clerk of House of Commons to make return of all recognizances.

The clerk of the House of Commons shall, within fourteen days next after every session of Parliament, make out an account of all recognizances certified by the speaker of the said House or estreated by him into the Exchequer, with the names and residences of the parties, and transmit the same to the [<sup>F1</sup>Lord Chancellor], and also a duplicate thereof to the said commissioners for auditing the public accounts.
