2. DISEASES OF ANIMALS

The Isles of Scilly (Importation of Animals Regulations) Order, 1949

1949 No. 2012

Made - - - 25th October, 1949

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1937, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Short Title

1. This Order may be cited as the Isles of Scilly (Importation of Animals Regulations) Order, 1949.

Power of Council to regulate the landing of cattle in the Isles of Scilly

- 2.—(i) The Council of the Isles of Scilly being authorised by the Isles of Scilly (Diseases of Animals Acts) Order, 1948(a) to exercise and perform the functions conferred or imposed on county councils by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1937 may make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the landing of cattle in any of the Isles of Scilly from the mainland of Great Britain and for requiring such animals to be accompanied by such declarations or certificates as may be prescribed in the regulations.
- (ii) The regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Offences

3. Any person committing or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of any regulations made under this Order shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties provided by Sections 52 and 53 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894(a) and Section 5 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1927(b).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order empowers the Council of the Isles of Scilly, subject to the approval of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, to make regulations governing the landing of cattle in the Islands for the purpose of preventing the introduction of disease into its area.
