The Coast Protection (Notices) Regulations, 1950

The Minister of Health in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 5 and 8 of the Coast Protection Act, 1949(a), hereby makes the following regulations:—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Coast Protection (Notices) Regulations, 1950, and shall come into operation on the first day of February, 1950.

(2) In these regulations “the Act” means the Coast Protection Act, 1949.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889(b), shall apply to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The notice to be published under subsection (1) of section 5 of the Act by a coast protection authority proposing to carry out, otherwise than under a works scheme, any coast protection work other than work of maintenance or repair shall contain the information specified in the form set out in the Schedule hereto and shall be in that form or in a form substantially to the like effect.

3. Where the estimated cost of:—

(a) the work to which a notice of proposal published under subsection (1) of section 5 of the Act relates, or

(b) the work specified in a works scheme of which a notice is published under subsection (1) of section 8 of the Act,

exceeds £50,000, the coast protection authority by whom the notice was published shall, at or as near as may be after the time of the first publication of the notice in a local newspaper, publish a like notice in the London Gazette.

4. Where a notice has been published by a coast protection authority under subsection (1) of section 5 or subsection (1) of section 8 of the Act the authority shall serve, in the former case, a like notice, and in the latter case, a copy of the scheme to which the notice relates, on the following authorities in addition to the authorities and persons required to be served therewith, respectively, by the said subsections, that is to say: every coast protection authority whose area adjoins their area and every county council, fishery board, local fisheries committee, harbour authority, conservancy authority and navigation authority within whose area of jurisdiction any of the proposed work or any of the work provided for by the scheme, as the case may be, is to be carried out.

5. A notice of objection to a proposal or scheme of which a notice has been published by a coast protection authority under subsection (1) of section 5 or subsection (1) of section 8 of the Act shall be in writing and shall contain a statement of the grounds of the objection and shall be served on the Minister by sending it by pre-paid post addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Health, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, and on the authority by so sending it addressed to the clerk of the authority at the authority's principal office, before the expiration of 28 days following the date of the first publication of the notice in a local newspaper.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The Regulations supplement provisions in the Act with respect to the content, service and publication of notices in connection with proposed coast protection works. In particular notification in the London Gazette is required in the case of works estimated to cost over £50,000.
