

RIGHTS OF WAY

The National Parks and Access to the Countryside
(Amendment) Regulations 1963

Made	20th May 1963
Laid before Parliament	23rd May 1963
Coming into Operation	27th May 1963

The Minister of Housing and Local Government, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 38 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations :—

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the National Parks and Access to the Countryside (Amendment) Regulations 1963, and shall come into force on 27th May 1963.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The following regulation shall be substituted for regulation 5 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Regulations 1950(c) :—

“5. Rights of way or alleged rights of way shall be shown on a rights of way map in any of the following manners :—

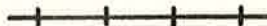
Footpath, by a continuous purple line, or by a continuous line with short bars at intervals, as thus :—



or by a broken black line with short intervals, as thus :—



Bridleway, by a continuous green line, or by a continuous line with cross bars, at intervals, as thus :—



or by a broken line with cross bars in the intervals, as thus :—



Road used as a public path, by a broken green line, or by a broken line and small arrowheads, as thus :—



3. The following provisions of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Regulations 1950 are hereby revoked :—

- (a) in regulation 3, the definitions of “ a public path order ”, “ a diversion order ” and “ an extinguishment order ” ;
- (b) regulations 7, 8 and 9 ;
- (c) in regulation 15, the words “ a public path order under section 40, a diversion order under section 42, an extinguishment order under section 43 ” ;
- (d) regulation 22 ;
- (e) schedule 1 ;
- (f) schedule 2, form No. 2 and form No. 5.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations make provision for alternative forms of notation for rights of way maps prepared under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, to facilitate their reproduction in monochrome. They also revoke certain provisions of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Regulations 1950, which are now contained in the Public Path Orders Regulations 1959 (S.I. 1959/2245 (1959 II, p. 2343)) made under the Highways Act 1959 (7 & 8 Eliz. 2. c. 25).
