**The Antigua Constitution and Elections Ordinance  
1951 (Amendment) Order 1965**

*Laid before Parliament* 29th November 1965

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 29th day of November 1965

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Her by section 5 of the West Indies Act 1962(a) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Antigua Constitution and Elections Ordinance 1951 (Amendment) Order 1965.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on 30th November 1965.

2.—(1) Section 51(8) of the Antigua Constitution and Elections Ordinance 1951(b) shall cease to have effect in relation to any withdrawal from his candidature of a duly nominated candidate for election effected after the coming into operation of this Order in so far as that subsection provides that all proceedings with reference to the election shall be commenced afresh as if the writ had been received on the day of such withdrawal.

(2) Where proceedings with reference to an election are required by the said section 51(8) to be commenced afresh on account of the withdrawal from his candidature of a duly nominated candidate before the coming into operation of this Order or the death of a candidate before the day fixed for the taking of the poll, the writ issued for the purpose of the election shall have effect as if for each of the days respectively specified therein in relation to the nomination of candidates, the taking of the poll and the return of the name of the member elected there were substituted the day sixteen days later than that day.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

Section 51(8) of the Antigua Constitution and Elections Ordinance 1951 provides that where a candidate for election to the Legislative Council of Antigua withdraws from his candidature in accordance with certain requirements of the section or dies before the day fixed for the taking of the poll, the returning officer shall give public notice of the withdrawal or death, and all proceedings with reference to the election shall be commenced afresh in all respects as if the writ for the election had been received on the day of such withdrawal or death. This Order provides that the requirement that all proceedings with reference to an election shall be commenced afresh shall cease to have effect in relation to any withdrawal from candidature effected after the coming into operation of the Order. It also makes provision as to the dates relating to the nomination of candidates, the taking of the poll and the return of the name of the member elected where proceedings are required to be commenced afresh because of a withdrawal from candidature before the coming into operation of the Order or the death of a candidate.

Whereas the Social Science Research Council is established by Royal Charter for purposes connected with scientific research and consists of persons appointed by a Minister of the Crown;

And whereas a draft of this Order has been laid before Parliament in pursuance of section 4(1) of the Science and Technology Act (1962) and approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament;

Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of section 4(1) of the said Act is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to enact, and it is hereby enacted, as follows:—

1. The Social Science Research Council, whose objects are specified in the Schedule to this Order, is established as a Research Council for purposes of the Science and Technology Act 1962.

2. This Order may be cited as the Social Science Research Council Order 1965 and shall come into operation on the 1st December 1965.

SCHEDULE

(a) To encourage and support by any means research in the social sciences by any other person or body.

(b) To make grants to the foregoing paragraph, to provide and operate facilities for common use in carrying on such research.

(c) To carry out research in the social sciences.

(d) To make grants to students for post graduate instruction in the social sciences.

(e) To provide advice and to disseminate knowledge concerning the social sciences.
