PLANT BREEDERS' RIGHTS
The Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) (Amendment No. 2)
Regulations 1966

Made - - - - 26th September 1966
Laid before Parliament 30th September 1966
Coming into Operation 3rd October 1966

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Secretary of State for the Home Department (being the Secretary of State concerned with agriculture in Northern Ireland), acting jointly, in exercise of the powers vested in them by sections 9 and 36 of the Plant Varieties and Seeds Act 1964(a), as extended to Northern Ireland by the Plant Varieties and Seeds (Northern Ireland) Order 1964(b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the approval of the Treasury, hereby make the following Regulations:—

Citation and Commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations 1966 and shall come into operation on 3rd October 1966.

Further Amendment of Schedule to Principal Regulations

2. The Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) Regulations 1965(c), as amended by the Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 1966(d), are hereby further amended by adding in the second and fourth columns of the Schedule thereto opposite the number "20" in the first column of the said Schedule and immediately after the words "(f) a rhubarb variety 15 0 0" the following words and figures in the following manner (the headings of the respective columns being here included for reference only):

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations further amend the Plant Breeders' Rights (Fees) Regulations 1965 by prescribing the fees payable for trials of further plant varieties for which plant breeders' rights may be granted.
