The Civil Aviation Act (Channel Islands) Order 1966

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 9th day of June 1966

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Her by section 67(1) of the Civil Aviation Act 1949(a), as read with sections 57(2) and 63(8) of that Act, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In Part II of the Schedule to the Civil Aviation Act (Channel Islands) Order 1953(b) (which sets out the modifications and adaptations of the Civil Aviation Act 1949 in its extension to the Channel Islands), for paragraph 21 there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“21. In section 57, immediately after subsection (3) there shall be added the following subsections:—

‘(4) In subsection (1) of this section the reference to the Minister shall be construed as including a reference in the case of Jersey to the States of Jersey and to the Harbours and Airport Committee thereof, and in the case of Guernsey to the Board of Administration of the States of Guernsey.

(5) Any Order in Council under this Act and any order or regulations made by the Secretary of State or the Minister under this Act or any directions given under any such order or regulations shall not come into force in Jersey or Guernsey until registered in the Royal Court.’”

2. This Order may be cited as the Civil Aviation Act (Channel Islands) Order 1966 and shall come into operation on 1st July 1966.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends the Civil Aviation Act (Channel Islands) Order 1953, which extends the Civil Aviation Act 1949 to the Channel Islands. Under section 57 of the Act as so extended Her Majesty may by Orders in Council made under certain enactments authorise the Secretary of State or the Minister of Aviation to make regulations for carrying out the purposes of those Orders in Council. The amendment made by the present Order enables Her Majesty to confer similar power on certain authorities in the Channel Islands.
