And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made therefor:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by the said section 12(8), Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The provisions of the Criminal Appeal Act 1966 specified in the Schedule to this Order shall come into operation on 1st January 1968.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Criminal Appeal Act 1966 (Commencement No. 2) Order 1967.
