Whereas a draft of the following Order has been laid before Parliament and approved by resolution of each House of Parliament:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by sections 2(6) and 6(2) of the Diplomatic Privileges Act 1964(a), and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. In Article 2(2) of the Diplomatic Privileges (Citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies) Order 1964(b), as amended by the Diplomatic Privileges (Citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies) (Amendment) Order 1965(c), for the words "and The Gambia" shall be substituted the words "The Gambia, Singapore, Guyana, Lesotho, Botswana and Barbados".
- 2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Diplomatic Privileges (Citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies) (Amendment) Order 1967.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order adds Singapore, Guyana, Lesotho, Botswana and Barbados to the list of countries to which Article 2 of the Diplomatic Privileges (Citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies) Order 1964 applies. The members of the diplomatic missions (and their private servants) of the countries to which Article 2 of the 1964 Order applies, being citizens of that country and also citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies, are entitled to the privileges and immunities to which they would have been entitled under the Diplomatic Privileges Act 1964 if they had not been citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies.
